REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Chair Brennan called the meeting to order at 7:33 a.m. The Board then adjourned into executive session, the stated purposes of which were—to consider employment matters pursuant to 121.22(G)(1), to consider real estate matters pursuant to 121.22(G)(2), to meet with legal counsel concerning litigation involving the University pursuant to 121.22(G)(3) and to review for collective bargaining sessions pursuant to 121.22(G)(4) of the Revised Code. The vote for approval was 7-0. On a vote of 7-0, the meeting returned to public session at 10:10 a.m.

REPORT OF THE CHAIR

Mrs. Brennan began the public session by noting that the current Board meeting was the first cycle operating under the new structure for committees, which she hopes all Trustees will find to be advantageous. She said she felt that the committee day that preceded the Board meeting by nine days provided an opportunity to truly reflect and discuss the various issues that the Board

faces. She noted that the passing of the annual budget, which would be addressed during the meeting, is a serious issue that involved difficult choices that were well thought out. She commended Mr. Cummins and Dr. Sherman for their efforts in the budget process.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT (See Appendix C)

REPORT OF THE STUDENT TRUSTEES

Ms. Duff said the arrival of the new student trustee is anxiously awaited, and Mr. Rich noted that the delayed appointment provided him with one more opportunity to serve on the Board. He said that he and Ms. Duff would be providing their input into the process for changing the core curriculum.

Mr. Rich and Ms. Duff then introduced featured students Brain Dudek and Andrew Maas (See Appendix D). Mr. Dudek and Mr. Maas each offered some remarks to the Board regarding their experiences at the University. They were each presented a commemorative clock from Trustees.

REPORT OF THE STRATEGIC ISSUES COMMITTEE

presented by Committee Co-chair York

At Mr. York's request, Dr. Sherman provided the highlights of his July 25 presentation on metrics for the Vision 2020 strategic plan. Mr. York then noted that, also during the July 25 committee meeting, Trustees received a plan of tentative Board and committee topics for Fiscal Year 2012. He asked for any comments or questions on the plan, which was in Board books under the Strategic Issues Tab. There were none.

REPORT OF THE RULES COMMITTEE

presented by Mr. York

1. O.A.C. 3359-22-03, Contract Professionals Advisory Committee

The revisions to the Rule were proposed by the Contract Professional Advisory Committee (CPAC) in order to simplify the Rule. CPAC will create a procedural manual containing the specific operational details about this Committee and intends to post this information on the CPAC website.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

presented by Committee Chair Palmisano and Vice Chair Pavloff using a consent agenda

1. FY2011-2012 General Fund and Auxiliary Budgets for Akron and Wayne (Tab 1)

As The University of Akron faces the largest reduction of state support in recent history, it simultaneously strives to invest in student success, global relevance and the other key goals of Vision 2020: The New Gold Standard.

REVENUES

Tuition and Fees: In compliance with state legislation, the approved undergraduate tuition increases were limited to 3.5 percent, effective in the fall 2011 term. Graduate tuition and fee increases also were held to 3.5 percent, School of Law tuition and fees increased by 6.5 percent. Those rates, approved by the Board of Trustees on June 15, 2011, are generally in line with the plans of the other Ohio public institutions. In addition to the revenue growth generated by the tuition increases, tuition and fee revenues also will be enhanced by an expected 3.5 percent increase in student credit hour production.

State Appropriations: Starting in FY12, state appropriations no longer include a Federal Fiscal Stabilization Fund component. The elimination of the federal support was a key contributing factor to the \$15 million decline from the FY11 actual appropriation. The FY12 State Share of Instruction appropriation is reduced 13.2 percent statewide within the FY 2012-13 Biennial Budget. The University sector is reduced by a greater amount (14.4 percent) than the two-year sector. Based on current estimates, the state reduction translates into a \$15 million loss for The University of Akron in spite of the 24 percent growth in credit hour production experienced since fall 2006 and anticipated continuance.

Investment Income: Anticipated earnings from investments/endowments of \$2.4 million reflect a slowly recovering economy and a corresponding improvement in the performance of the portfolio.

EXPENDITURES

The budget proposal includes \$20 million in expenditures intended to address Capacity Assurance, Strategic Investments and Fiscal Integrity. Those investments are in line with the University's strategic plan as described in Vision 2020: The New Gold Standard.

- Capacity Assurance \$10.2 million (compensation and off-campus credit support)
- Strategic Investments \$7.8 million (scholarships, start-up funding and investment pool)
- Fiscal Integrity \$2.0 million (budget stabilization fund)

Compensation: Investment in the University's largest asset, hired talent, is a key to the success of institutional goals. The FY12 budget includes sufficient funds to support merit pools for all qualifying employees. It also is essential that faculty needs are supported as enrollment continues to grow, which is evident in the proposed strategic investment in full-time faculty.

The \$2 million increase in fringe benefits is primarily in group insurance and retirement costs. FY12 will be the first full year under the new self-insured medical plan, and it is imperative that any FY11 balances in that area be preserved as a contingency reserve for future medical expenditures and potential excessive claims.

Scholarships and Fee Remissions: To maintain scholarship funding, the annual budget of \$391.4 million supports increases consistent with proposed tuition and fee increases. That practice results in an expense increase of \$2.6 million (inclusive of employee and dependent fee remissions). Enrollment growth generates additional fees, most of which are restricted either internally or by law. In FY12, that growth represents an increase in budgeted distributions of about \$1.9 million in course fees, technology fees, facility fees and the like.

Miscellaneous: Incremental revenues resulting from the 6.5 percent increase in law tuition will be set aside in a new building reserve (\$806,000) and for School of Law bar exam awards (\$111,000).

Support to auxiliaries is proposed to remain fairly even with FY11 support. Because a large portion of the Athletics budget is dedicated to scholarships and salaries, flat support for FY12 generates the need for operational reductions within that auxiliary to absorb the impact of the tuition increase. An increase of \$200,000 is recommended for E. J. Thomas Performing Arts Hall to provide the support needed to maintain operations at the current level. Institution-wide debt service of \$31 million reflects an increase of roughly \$1 million over FY11. Auxiliaries are responsible for \$24 million of those annual payments. To fund the investments necessary to support institutional goals, it is necessary to balance the budget via the use of one-time funds of \$8.4 million, plus permanent budget reductions of \$3 million. The permanent reductions will be allocated to each dean and vice president following Board approval, and they will be required to identify the reductions no later than December 31, 2011.

SUMMARY

The FY12 budget request was based on the overarching principles discussed above. It absorbs a reduction in state funding of nearly \$15 million and provides for some reallocation of funds to support identified goals. While the FY12 budget includes \$8.4 million of savings from FY11 to balance, a plan is being developed to fully absorb the reduction of state support and continue moving toward University goals in FY13 and beyond.

The tuition and fee increases were considered seriously and with great consternation. Unfortunately, the current fiscal situation gives The University of Akron little flexibility in the short term. The combination of SB6 requirements, tuition caps, declining state support, and a slow economic recovery places all publicly supported institutions in a difficult fiscal situation.

2. Revised Course Fees (Tab 2)

Revised course fees were proposed by the College of Business Administration and Summit College. Those proposed revisions for Summit College were not available when the Board reviewed proposed FY2012 course and miscellaneous fees for all other units on June 15, 2011. The revisions for the College of Business reduce the fees for the new weekend MBA program that were approved in June. The fees approved in June were overstated because they did not take into account the 3.5-percent tuition increase that also was approved then.

DISCUSSION: Judge Bond noted that Dr. Cynthia Capers was retiring and, on behalf of the Board, commended her for fine service to the University and wished her well. Dr. Sherman suggested that Dr. Capers would be considered for emeritus status.

ACTION: Motion by Palmisano on behalf of committee for approval of Resolution 8-5-11 passed 7-0.

Mr. York left the meeting at 11:15 a.m.

4. Purchases of \$25,000 to \$350,000 (Tab 4) INFORMATION ONLY

For May 2011, there were 18 purchases in this category totaling \$1,485,969. For June 2011, 23 purchases totaled \$1,024,138.

5. Waiver of Competitive Bidding (Tab 5) INFORMATION ONLY

The Vice President for Capital Planning and Facilities Management requested a waiver of the required competitive bidding process for the repair of high-temperature piping along the west side of the James A. Rhodes Arena before the start of fall semester. The project entails multiple steps prior to Physical Facilities being able to verify the scope of the work for the contractor. Once the scope of work was known, there would not have been adequate time to perform the repairs via the normal competitive bidding process. The anticipated cost for this repair is \$100,000. The waiver of competitive bidding was reviewed and approved by the Department of Purchasing and the Office of General Counsel.

6. Priority Budget Issues for May 2011 (Tab 6) INFORMATION ONLY

Tuition and fee revenues were greater than budgeted by \$2.2 million as enrollment exceeded anticipated growth. State Share of Instruction was \$0.9 million less than budget by year's end.

Through May, total faculty expenditures (including summer and part time) were 2.6 percent greater than the same time last year, while administrative and staff expenses were even with FY10 spending. Scholarships, including graduate assistant fee remissions, were 9.6 percent (or \$3.5 million) greater than last May. While a component of that overage was anticipated as a part of the long-term scholarship plan, graduate assistant fee remissions still exceed the budget by \$0.6 million. Travel expenses passed last May's totals by 5.5 percent (or nearly \$184,000), and May utility expenses were slightly less than last year's by 0.8 percent (or \$70,000). Eleven-month auxiliary results were favorable with net ending fund balances of \$12.9 million and a projected negative variance of \$262,000.

 Mr. Curtis reported on the status of state-funded projects, university-funded projects and planning-related projects and issues.
- 9. Master Banking and Signatory Resolutions (Tab 9)

Due to changes in personnel, two resolutions and a signature certificate were proposed for banking and securities transactions purposes. The resolutions and certificate reflect recent personnel changes and the addition of a new bank account to accommodate the University's self-insurance health care plan. The updates, which were required simply for the purpose of identifying as a matter of record current signatory authority, do not represent any deviation from approved banking and investment practices. Following Board approval of the resolutions and signature certificate, signed copies were to be filed with JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A., the University's master depository bank of record, and all other custodial banks holding University assets.

RESOLUTIONS 8-6-11 and 8-7-11 (See Appendix B)

10. Purchases for more than \$350,000 (Tab 10)

The College of Polymer Science proposed an award to B&B Microscopes Limited of Pittsburg, Pa. for an Olympus FluoView FV1000MPE multi-photon laser scanning microscope and accessories costing \$546,975. The purchase is classified as a sole-source purchase since B&B Microscopes Limited is the sole authorized distributor of Olympus equipment in Ohio, and the purchase is covered by an existing IUC Contract, UN-036. The instrument is a critical piece of new infrastructure for the University and its growing biological sciences. There are only two other instruments like it in Ohio (Cleveland Clinic and OSU). It enables long-term imaging of sensitive biological samples, including live specimens, and is of significant interest to external users who will help to support its maintenance through user fees. Funding for the service will be from account number 5-32907, ABIA Match to Foster DOE Grant.

The Department of Information Technology Services proposed an award to Oracle Corporation for \$1,589,492 for annual support and license fees for PeopleSoft enterprise resource software. It is used at the University to enable all administrative functions such as financial tracking, payroll, human capital management, student registration, financial aid,

admissions and other critical functions. The licensing fees are required by contractual agreement to use the software, and the support ensures that the regulatory functions will be in place. Tax updates, student loan regulatory, end-of-year payroll and tax processing, and mandated reporting are some of the support services. The period of the maintenance support covered is June 2011-May 2012. Funding for the service will be from account number 2-00282, PeopleSoft License.

The Department of Information Technology Services also proposed purchasing software from Oracle to facilitate moving the University to a more structured data and strategic-decision support system. The purchase of \$526,959 will include the addition of Oracle's PeopleSoft Campus Solutions Enterprise Performance Management software and Oracle's Business Intelligence product known as OBIEE. That type of enterprise effort is commonly referred to as a data warehouse. Funding for the service will be from account number 2-00701, Student Information Tech Fees.

11. Cumulative Gift and Grant Income Report for July 2010-June 2011 (Tab 11)

For July 2010-June 2011, total giving was \$46.7 million, a new record high that is 14 percent more than the \$40.8 million received for FY2010 and 27 percent more than the five-year average of \$36.6 million. The number of gifts decreased from 21,911 for July 2009-June 2010 to 21,121 gifts for the 2010-2011 fiscal year.

6. Research Grants and Sponsored Programs Report, June 2011 (Tab 6)

Annual combined research and sponsored program awards for the University and its Research Foundation exceeded \$50 million for the first time in University history, setting a new record at \$50.9 million during 2010-2011. For July 2010-June 2011, funding for externally funded research and other sponsored programs was \$50,902,802 for 491 projects. For July 2009-June 2010, funding was \$48,380,893 for 456 projects. For July 2010-June 2011, 10 patents were issued, 48 patent applications were filed, and 82 disclosures were submitted. For July 2009-June 2010, eight patents were issued, 26 patent applications were filed, and 38 disclosures were submitted.

APPENDIX C: REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

Dr. Proenza reiterated to the Board that, as mentioned at the Board meeting in June, the format of his report has been adjusted to focus more on addressing the key issues in higher education that Trustees may find useful to their deliberations and to the tasks of making The University of Akron the very best it can be. Although a smaller portion of his remarks will be devoted to University achievements and events, many of which already are known, Dr. Proenza said, recognizing the good work of our faculty, staff and students is important, so he plans to continue highlighting a few examples at the conclusion of his remarks. He said he would welcome Trustees' suggestions or recommendations about key topics that they may wish to have him address in the future.

Dr. Proenza cited a statement often heard at national and international meetings – American universities are the best in the world. While agreeing in general with that statement, Dr. Proenza said that he has yet to meet a university that has a monopoly on green grass or on weeds.

Dr. Proenza said that many claim the strength of American higher education lies in its diversity, while others simply state that our universities are the best in the world in a form of unexamined self-congratulations. Acknowledging that Trustees are aware of the many criticisms now being leveled at higher education, Dr. Proenza reflected that history reveals a recurring tendency among external and internal constituencies of universities – indeed, of almost every large organization in our society – to be critical of their respective institutions in one form or another. Not so long ago, that tendency was reflected in works such as "The Hollow Men," "Illiberal Education" or "Inside American Education," among many others that have come and gone. In the last few years, the popular press has made much of such books as Richard Vedder's "Going Broke by Degree," Ron Ehrenberg's "Tuition Rising," or most recently, "Academically Adrift" by Richard Arum and Jospia Roksa. Dr. Proenza noted that both Dr. Vedder and Dr. Arum have been guests at our campus.

Dr. Proenza pointed out that, in the last few months, questions have been voiced about the very value of higher education, with one critic going so far as to offer \$100,000 to talented students to forego higher education entirely. In the case of truly extraordinary students, Dr. Proenza said he would encourage them to take that offer, noting that such individuals may well become the next Bill Gates, Steve Jobs or Mark Zuckerberg, none of whom had such an opportunity of gaining \$100,000 to forego Harvard or wherever they might have been. Dr. Proenza noted that he has often said if an institution accepts only the very best students, that institution does not have to bear responsibility for the achievements of such students, because they will do it all for themselves. Those institutions can then claim the success without having done a thing about it.

Dr. Proenza described an informal study done at the conclusion of commencement exercises at Harvard. When a group of graduates was asked a few simple questions that any baccalaureate-level educated person should have been able to answer, not one of those Harvard graduates could do so. In other words, even Harvard had not accomplished what most believe higher education should have provided. The point of this illustration, Dr. Proenza said, is that higher education is in a state of flux, and no single critique is likely to be true of all universities or to tell the whole picture.

In fact, he said, higher education critiques suffer from some of the same maladies affecting critiques of K-12 education, namely that education is a subject in which everyone proclaims that they are an expert, and yet no one takes the time to read the evidence or to do the research that would be necessary to have evidence on the subject. Indeed, Dr. Proenza said, this is not unlike medicine, where evidence-based medicine is suspect because physicians already believe they know everything there is to know.

A more nuanced and balanced picture is needed, Dr. Proenza said. He recommended a few more thoughtful and informative works, such as Jonathan Cole's "The Great American University," Donald Kennedy's "Academic Duty," Henry Rosovsky's "The University: An Owner's Manual" and the recent National Academy of Science's report "Rising Above the Gathering Storm Revisited."

Dr. Proenza said that every industry is open to criticism, but what is true of one institution or one institution within an industry may be totally irrelevant to another. Some complaints are fully justified; others not at all. Like health care, higher education has not shown the major productivity gains of most other industries. It requires new business models to achieve better efficiencies and output. That is why The University of Akron's Vision 2020 Strategic Plan is built upon a framework of relevance, connectivity and productivity.

Dr. Proenza said that, if The University of Akron should become one of the enterprise universities envisioned by Chancellor Petro, its model must include entrepreneurial initiatives that yield alternative revenue streams and increase productivity. He said the strategies outlined in Vision 2020 seek to broaden our revenue base and increase our productivity through expanded initiatives, many of which have been discussed previously.

In addition, Dr. Proenza said, the University must continue to leverage its strengths through collaborations that have strong growth potential, such as the Austen BioInnovation Institute in Akron and the Corrosion and Reliability Engineering Program.

He said that we must focus on ways to achieve truly major productivity gains in higher education. Dr. Proenza commended the governor and legislature for removing from the budget the requirement that faculty members teach one more course per year. He said the idea may be politically attractive but likely would yield modest productivity gains at best as the issue has been, and continues to be, addressed through appropriate benchmarking.

Dr. Proenza said the needed approaches are those that will deliver ten-fold or greater increases in productivity. He said that is why the integrator/assessor model for higher education and public-private partnerships are being considered—because of their potential to yield truly substantial and sustained productivity gains.

In summary, Dr. Proenza asked Trustees not to fall prey to every criticism but rather to understand that higher education is an industry in transition and that The University of Akron already has demonstrated national leadership with innovative approaches. Our institution will

benefit most, Dr. Proenza added, by the Board's bringing forward the ideas that apply to the initiatives the University is taking.

Dr. Proenza then shared some significant highlights:

- The University's development team under the leadership of Vice President LaGuardia and Associate Vice President DuFore reported a record-breaking fund raising year.
- Chancellor Jim Petro was finalizing his Enterprise University concept proposal to be delivered to the Inter-University Council on August 5 and presented in more detail at the Ohio Trustee Conference on August 11. The first phase is expected to give universities greater operational freedom by removing some present legislative "band-aids."
- During the summer, the University's athletics camps drew more than 4,800 youths to campus. Also, several of the colleges held academic-oriented programs, with many focused on the STEM disciplines, for hundreds—if not, thousands—of primary and secondary students.
- Brian Radesic, associate director of the nurse anesthesia program, was named the national 2011 Clinical Instructor of the Year by the American Association of Nurse Anesthetists.
- Wayne Watkins, associate vice president for research, presented the Akron Model at the annual meeting of Urban Serving Universities, which is a component of the Association of Public Land-Grant Universities.

Dr. Proenza concluded his remarks by reporting that he had just returned from the biannual Department of Defense Corrosion Conference, where he shared the Akron Model. Other colleagues in attendance were—Dean Haritos, who presented a significant paper on the University's Corrosion Engineering program; Sue Louscher, executive director, strategic partnerships and government programs; and a large contingent of UA sophomore students who impressively presented their research results to the rapt attention of many experts in the field.

APPENDIX D: FEATURED STUDENTS' BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES

Brian Dudek is entering his senior year of study majoring in AYA mathematics at The University of Akron. He is beginning to work on his Senior Research Project for the Honors College. His research will explore why students enroll in remedial math courses.

Brian has liked math since his father introduced the subject to him at an early age. Because of that early interest and the examples of caring teachers and coaches throughout the years, Brian intends to become a teacher and coach. Through his middle and high school experiences, Brian came to believe that the opportunity for a teacher and coach to guide youth is greater than in any other profession.

Among Brian's primary role models is his sister, Katie . . . also a Green High School graduate who, coincidentally, was the initial recipient of the Mallo Family Scholarship Award endowed through the University of Akron Foundation by Ted and JoAnn Mallo. During his time here at the University, Brian has excelled greatly, as—a member of the STEM program since its start; a member of the College of Education's Dean's Dozen; a student-athlete, competing for the Zips Track & Field and Cross Country teams; and a fan of the other sporting events around campus. In addition, Brian has kept in contact with several former teachers and coaches. He says that they had a great impact on him, and he hopes to have such an impact on his own students. The son of Joe and Patty Dudek, Brian also is the brother of two Akron alumni, Katie and Christopher.

Andrew Maas is entering his third year in our School of Law, pursuing a J.D. and L.L.M. with a certificate in intellectual property. In his spare time he is a husband, father of four, assistant coach for Little League baseball, volunteer teacher and youth mentor for his church and an assistant den leader in a local Cub Scout pack.

A native of Colorado, Andy moved to Puerto Rico as a 19-year-old missionary for his church and became fluent in Spanish. During that time, he developed lifelong goals for learning and service. Andy graduated from Brigham Young University in August 2003 with a bachelor's degree in civil engineering and, in December 2004, received a master's degree in civil engineering with an emphasis in structural engineering from The University of Texas at Austin. He worked for more than four years as a licensed professional engineer in Texas before entering Akron Law in August 2009.

During his first year there, Andy was the founding President of the J. Reuben Clark Law Society, and subsequently has served as President Elect and President. He also has served as the President and Treasurer of the Intellectual Property and Technology Law Association.

He provided significant leadership and support in the preparation and winning of the i6 Challenge EDA Grant last summer, which awarded \$2.2 million jointly to the Austen BioInnovation Institute in Akron and the University of Akron Research Foundation. He now administers that grant.

APPENDIX E: REPORT OF THE PROVOST

After adding his congratulations to Mr. LaGuardia, Mr. DuFore and Dr. Newkome for the outstanding performance of their areas, Dr. Sherman introduced his report as his "Ready, Set, Go" comments.

READY ...

Dr. Sherman said summer had set the stage for the activities planned for autumn. While summer enrollment was comparatively flat, he said, there have been significant interactions with the deans and others in the Office of Academic Affairs to develop some very interesting and innovative programming opportunities to further activate the campus in future summers.

During summer 2011, he said—(1) the Student Recreation and Wellness Center had the largest number of visits, approximately 22,000, more than in any previous summer; (2) Athletics engaged more than 4,800 students in youth sport camps; (3) the TRIO and STEP programs had more than 250 participants in summer bridge programs designed for successful transition to college life; and (4) Akron Public Schools held programs on campus with various bridge programs that connected with 600 students.

Dr. Sherman pointed out that all of those activities provided opportunities for individuals to receive information about the University, to see and experience the campus, and to be recruited to the University.

SET ...

With regard to meeting the needs of students for fall classes, Dr. Sherman said only six classes remained without assigned locations at the time. He reminded Trustees that, at the same time last year, more than 38 classes were yet to be assigned locations. He said the significant improvement is due to cooperation of the department chairs, school directors, deans and faculty through discussions with administration about synchronizing class schedules within days and across days of the week to optimize efficiency of space utilization. There will be a report on this matter at a future meeting.

Dr. Sherman reported that 5,812 new students have participated in new student orientation, a 4 percent increase over the same time last year. He added that a record number of family members, approximately 4,400 or a 3 percent increase, have accompanied those students. Preliminary estimates suggest that total student headcount will be up 2.2 percent, and total credit hours will be up approximately 2.6 percent over the same time last year. Dr. Sherman said he anticipates that the objectives for total enrollment for autumn and spring will be met, although we will not know until the day of the official count. Within those numbers, he said, freshman admissions are up 2 percent, transfer admissions are up 14 percent, and other categories, such as Post-Secondary Educational Opportunity Program and post-baccalaureate, are up 22 percent. Graduate student headcount is down slightly, but law school headcount is up 6 percent.

Dr. Sherman described a new initiative to assist Trustees in making data-informed decisions by creating and providing them with a data source book comprised of Ohio higher education data, eventually also to include national normative data. He noted that standardized reports for higher education are available at the Ohio Board of Regents and many of the reports include data that have been tracked for over 10 years and are aggregated into five-, ten- and three-year time frames. Those data are available for comparison within various categories (such as student enrollment, degrees conferred, etc.) and are provided for all public higher education institutions in Ohio. Dr. Sherman said he envisions direct applications for the data both to inform the Board's metrics and to further advance evaluation of the University's progress on Vision 2020.

2 *Purchases for More than \$350,000

The College of Polymer Science is proposing an award to Physical Electronics for a Versa Probe II X-ray Photoelectron Spectroscopy (XPS) with accessories in the amount of \$769,000. The funding for this purchase is provided by the Department of Energy, Account No. 5-32318. This purchase is classified as a sole source purchase; therefore, competitive bidding is not required under University Rules. The College further advises that this instrument is a critical piece of new infrastructure for The University of Akron and its growing interest in the areas of energy and biomaterials.

Information Technology Services (ITS) is proposing the award of contracts to Dell Marketing, L.P. for Windows laptop computers, CDW-G for Lenovo Windows tablet computers, and Apple Computer for Apple computer systems for a total purchase request not to exceed \$2 million. It is imperative to keep state-ofthe art technology in the hands of the faculty in order to stay current with students. The current laptops purchased in 2007 for full-time faculty are four years old, and the warranties have expired. The University should use this opportunity to upgrade the older laptops to state-of-the-art technology while providing technology choices to enhance the classroom experience. Information Technology Services will fund the \$2 million from the technology fees for the standard model laptop or tablet, insurance, refurbishing the collected computers, and extended warranty. All upgrade costs for the high-end Apple laptop will be the responsibility of the requesting department. The funding requested will also provide for the collected laptops to be refurbished to replace older technology across campus, increase student access to laptop technology, create loaner availability, and provide the technology for part-time faculty, in order to utilize the technology for three more years.

*Request for Renewal of Lease—Holmes County Higher Education Center

Since May 2002, Wayne College has maintained a lease with Eagle B Leasing Company, Ltd., for the second floor of a building located at 88 East Jackson Street in Millersburg, Ohio, wherein is housed the Holmes County Higher Education Center (HCHEC). The existing lease for this 3,800 sq. ft. space expired on August 1, and Tami Lowe, senior director for Business and Finance at Wayne College, is requesting permission to exercise a three-year renewal option ending on July 31, 2014. Eagle B Leasing Company is agreeable to the extension and has prepared a Notice of Exercise of Option to Extend Lease with the only change in terms being an increase in the rent based on current Consumer Price Index data. Effective August 1, 2011, the proposed rent will increase from the current \$2,060 per month to \$2,367 per month (\$28,404 annually), representing an annual increase of \$3,684. The terms of the proposed lease extension have been reviewed and approved by the Office of General Counsel, which will complete execution of the agreement immediately upon its approval by the Board of Trustees.

4 *Cumulative Gift and Grant Income Report

For July 2011, giving totaled \$1.4 million, 35 percent less than the \$2.1 million received for July 2010 and 24 percent less than the five-year average of \$1.8 million. The number of gifts decreased, from 1,254 for July 2010 to 1,071 gifts for this fiscal year to date.

8 Quarterly Report for Year Ended June 30, 2011 and Priority Budget Issues for June 2011

Year-to-date total revenues exceed the budget estimate for FY11 by \$5.3 million. Tuition and fee revenues are greater than budgeted by \$2.3 million as enrollment exceeded the anticipated growth. State Share of Instruction was \$0.9 million less than budget.

Revenues from Departmental Sales and Services operations exceeded the FY11 budget by \$3.7 million (largely in Computer Solutions and the English Language Institute). In aggregate, the auxiliaries operated in line with budget. The net operating surpluses generated just over \$55,000.

Year-to-date total expenditures are below the budget estimate for FY11 by \$3.1 million after transferring \$8.7 million in health insurance under spending to a new reserve fund. The expenditure amount also includes \$6 million that was placed in Reserves at the end of the fiscal year.

Soccer Stadium: Based on the timing of the donation, formal bidding would make restrooms available on October 28 rather than September 28. An active construction site hosting athletic events drawing 3,000 - 4,000 attendees presents multiple risks, including:

- Open excavation;
- Exposed electrical wires;
- Construction materials and trip hazards.
- By accelerating the construction we reduce the risks to 30% of the season rather than over 70%.
- We eliminated cold weather construction with the related cost premiums.

Grant Hi-Rise: The maintenance work performed by our T&M contractors would not normally require a waiver as the value of each contract is below Board thresholds. The Director of Purchasing requires additional support to justify using our T&M contractors.

- Work required exceeded PFOC's capacity and resources.
- Flooring missing tiles present trip hazards. Worn, frayed, and buckled carpeting posed trip hazards throughout corridors and high traffic areas.
- Lighting existing lighting was below required illumination levels (fc).
- Due to associated odor, more time is required before move in to avoid allergy reactions.
- Traditional bidding of this portion of the work would not have permitted completion before student occupancy.

SUBJECT: Purchases for More than \$350,000

The following purchases for more than \$350,000 are recommended for approval by the Board of Trustees at its meeting on September 21, 2011.

1. Physical Electronics: The College of Polymer Science is proposing an award to Physical Electronics, Chanhassen, MN for a Versa Probe II X-ray Photoelectron Spectroscopy (XPS) with accessories in the amount of \$769,000. The funding for this purchase is provided by the Department of Energy, Account No. 5-32318. This purchase is classified as a sole source purchase; therefore, competitive bidding is not required under University Rules.

The College of Polymer Science advises that this XPS provides elemental analysis of surfaces under high vacuum conditions and is also capable of chemical mapping, measurements of work function, and precise depth analysis using the latest technology of a C60 gun. This surface technique is critical for analyzing surfaces of polymeric materials that are used in the area of energy, biomaterials, and adhesives.

The College further advises that this instrument is a critical piece of new infrastructure for The University of Akron and its growing interest in the areas of energy and biomaterials. Potential users of this equipment include the College of Polymer Science and Polymer Engineering, the College of Engineering, Arts and Sciences, local industries, ABIA, and hospital partners.

The purchase of a Versa Probe II and accessories from Physical Electronics is acceptable to the College of Polymer Science, the Office of General Counsel, and the Department of Purchasing.

I recommend that an award be made to Physical Electronics in the amount of \$769,000 and request your approval and that of the Board of Trustees at its meeting on September 21, 2011.

2. <u>Laptop Refresh Program:</u> Information Technology Services (ITS) is proposing the award of contracts to Dell Marketing, L.P. for Windows laptop computers, CDW-G for

Lenovo Windows tablet computers and Apple Computer for Apple computer systems. Deployment of laptop computers at The University of Akron continues to enhance the academic mission and provide an advantage to our faculty and students. From the initial Law School pilot program approved by the Board of Trustees in December 2000, to the successful faculty laptop initiative launched in September 2001, laptops have become an integral part of the wireless computing technology on campus.

It is imperative to keep state-of-the art technology in the hands of the faculty in order to stay current with students. The current laptops purchased in 2007 for full-time faculty are four years old and the warranties have expired. The University should use this opportunity to upgrade the older laptops to state-of-the-art technology while providing technology choices to enhance the classroom experience. The collection, distribution, and data transfer will take several months and is planned to start in October and extend through the fall semester.

Information Technology Services facilitated a team (laptop committee) of faculty and department technical directors to identify and configure the new technology. Similar to the 2007 rollout, the committee realizes that one size does not fit all. Therefore, the committee has recommended continuing with the choices of a Windows laptop, Windows Pen-Tablet, and an Apple option for the faculty. The faculty may select either a standard Windows laptop, a standard Windows Tablet, a standard Apple laptop, or a high-end Apple laptop. The high-end Apple laptop is needed by departments with high resolution graphic requirements. The configurations for the standard Windows laptop and Tablet are robust; therefore, a high-end model is not needed. When a department deviates from the standard Windows model, it will be required to fund the price difference.

It is projected that 60% of the computers purchased will be the standard Windows laptop, 20% the standard Tablet laptop, and 20% Apple laptops.

The Department of Purchasing solicited proposals for these computer systems from Dell, Hewlett Packard, Lenovo (IBM), Fujitsu, and Apple. The proposal was also publicly posted to the University's "Bids and RFP's" web site and made available through the Public Purchase bid tool. The laptop committee voted to request proposals from only Tier 1 vendors as defined by Gartner Group, Inc., plus Apple Computer to ensure acceptable performance for the University's environment and needs. Since Apple is a unique provider, they were not included in the RFP process. A direct quote will be requested from them. Based on the RFP responses, and after deliberation, the laptop committee selected Dell as the Windows laptop vendor of choice and Lenovo as the Windows Tablet vendor of choice for the refresh proposal. This decision was based on pricing, testing of evaluation units, serviceability, references, and third-party reviews.

Based on the actual combination of the various models of Dell, Lenovo, and Apple, the total purchase request is not to exceed \$2 million. Information Technology Services will fund the \$2 million from the technology fees for the standard model laptop or tablet, insurance, refurbishing the collected computers, and extended warranty. All upgrade costs for the high-end Apple laptop will be the responsibility of the requesting department.

The funding requested will also provide for the collected laptops to be refurbished to replace older technology across campus, increase student access to laptop technology, create loaner availability, and provide the technology for part-time faculty, in order to utilize the technology for three more years.

The computer systems as supplied by Dell, Lenovo thru their authorized distributor, CDW-G, and Apple are acceptable to Information Technology Services, the Department of Purchasing, and the Office of General Counsel.

If you concur, I recommend that an award be made to each of Dell, CDW-G, and Apple, and request your approval and that of the Board of Trustees at its meeting on September 21, 2011.

SUBJECT: Request for Renewal of Lease—Holmes County Higher Education Center

Since May of 2002, Wayne College has maintained a lease with the Eagle B Leasing Company, Ltd., for the second floor of a building located at 88 East Jackson Street in Millersburg, Ohio, wherein is housed the Holmes County Higher Education Center (HCHEC). The existing lease for this 3,800 sq. ft. space expired on August 1st, and Tami Lowe, Sr. Director for Business & Finance at Wayne College, is requesting permission to exercise a three-year renewal option ending on July 31, 2014.

Mrs. Lowe's recommendation to renew this lease arrangement is based on the HCHEC's continued success and steady enrollment, which is estimated at 300 for the 2011-12 academic year.

Eagle B Leasing Company is agreeable to the extension and has prepared a "Notice of Exercise of Option to Extend Lease" (attached) with the only change in terms being an increase in the rent based on current Consumer Price Index data. Effective August 1, 2011, the proposed rent will increase from the current \$2,060 per month to \$2,367 per month (\$28,404 annually), representing an annual increase of \$3,684.

The terms of the proposed lease extension have been reviewed and approved by the Office of General Counsel, which will complete execution of the agreement immediately upon its approval by the Board of Trustees.

With your concurrence, I recommend the proposed three-year extension of the lease agreement with Eagle B Leasing Company for the Holmes County Higher Education Center be presented to the Board of Trustees for review and approval at its meeting on September 21, 2011.












UA Annual Giving










The University of Akron


Exhibit 11 Campaign Goal Exceeded



The University of Akron Office of Resource Analysis and Budget GLOSSARY OF FINANCIAL REPORTING TERMS

AUXILIARY – An accounting entity wilhin the current fund conducted primarily to provide goods, facilities and services to – and generate revenue from – students, faculty, staff and the general public.

CAPITAL COMPONENT – A line item in the state of Ohio operating budget which provides funds for capital projects. This line item is included in the state's operating budget. The state has provided universities with the ability to accept 15 annual installments in lieu of forgone capital allocations either in a lump sum, or over time. The University of Akron has agreed to collect the capital component allocation over time – we currently collect roughly \$2.5 million per year and transfer it out to the reserves for retirement of debt related to capital projects.

CARRYOVER – At the end of each fiscal year, the current fund has unspent resources. These resources are transferred into the succeeding fiscal year to provide spending authority in addition to the annual budget.

DEPARTMENTAL SALES – Revenues and expenditures which:

- 1. relate incidentally to the conduct of instruction, research and public service; and
- 2. relate to activities that exist to provide an instructional and/or laboratory experience for students while creating goods or services that may be sold to the campus community or the general public.

FUNDS:

Unrestricted Current Funds

- General fund Classification of resources and expenditures that are either directly or indirectly in support of instruction, research and public service without specific restrictions. Primary sources of these funds are student tuition and fees, departmental sales, state share of instruction, investment income and indirect cost recovery.
- <u>Auxiliary funds</u> Revenues and expenditures directly linked to the annual operation of any of the institution's auxiliaries and that are not restricted (see definition of Auxiliary).

Restricted Current Funds

- Sponsored programs Research grants funded with state, federal, corporate, or other resources. The funds are required to be spent on the specific projects as outlined in the contract.
- Restricted gifts Monetary donations to the institution that carry restrictions on how they can be used. Most common restrictions are that the funds be used for scholarships or as supplements to operations in specified departments.
- Other restricted funds for a specific purpose.

Loan Funds – The primary purpose of this fund group is to account for the resources available for loans to students.

Endowment Funds - These include funds received from a donor with the restriction that the principal is not expendable. The principal is invested for the purpose of producing present and future income which may be expended or added to the principal.

Plant Funds

- Current capital expenses
- Capital assets and equipment

Agency funds

- Student organizations
- Other outside agencies

EXPENSE POOLS – Classifications of types of expenditures broken into two major categories: Personnel and Operating (non-personnel). The pools are general, such as supplies and travel. Within each pool, there are more specific expense accounts which enable users to report types of purchases. For example, within the Supplies & Services expense pool, there is an account for Instructional Supplies.

E&G FUNCTIONS – (Education & General – also referred to as I&G, or Instructional and General). Reporting requirements define the functions into which we must categorize all unrestricted current fund expenditures. These functions group expenses based on how they contribute to the institution's mission. They are as follows (including examples):

- <u>Instruction and Departmental Research</u> All direct and applicable expenditures for activities that are part of an institution's instructional program (i.e., faculty compensation and supplies related to the classroom).
- <u>Separately Budgeted Research</u> All expenditures for activities specifically organized to produce research outcomes (i.e., indirect cost redistributions, faculty research grants).
- <u>Public Service</u> All funds expended for activities that are established primarily to provide non-credit courses and services to the community at large (i.e., workforce development, continuing education, and departmental sales operations offering products or services to the public).
- <u>Academic Support</u> All funds expended for support services that assist those operations directly focused on instruction, research and public service (i.e., libraries, dean's offices, information technology fee expenses).
- <u>Student Services</u> All funds expended for the administration and operation of
 offices of admission and registration and those activities whose primary purpose is
 to contribute to the students' emotional, physical, cultural and social growth
 outside the context of formal instructional programs (i.e., admissions, financial aid,
 and registrar).
- <u>Institutional Support</u> Expenditures for operations that provide support services to the total University (i.e., information technology services, legal, financial overhead).

- Operation and Maintenance of Plant Expenditures for operation and maintenance of the physical plant – does not include capital expenditures for new construction (i.e., utilities, custodial, buildings and grounds maintenance).
- <u>Scholarhips and Fellowships</u> Expenditures for institutional scholarships and setasides for need-based scholarships.

IGB (Institute for Global Business) – A line item in the state budget which is intended to supplement The University of Akron's International Business program.

INDIRECT COST RECOVERY/DISTRIBUTION – Funds built into external grants to reimburse overhead of the institution and the investigating parties.

STATE SHARE OF INSTRUCTION (SSI) – State funds provided to Ohio's public colleges and universities in support of core academic activities. The distribution calculations are primarily enrollment-driven and based on actual average costs.

TRANSFERS IN – The movement of resources into one fund from another. In the unrestricted current fund, transfers-in most often are to fund carryovers. The budget assumes transfers-in from reserves and from auxiliary fund balances to meet the need for resources.

TRANSFERS OUT MANDATORY – The movement of resources out of a fund to meet a required need. In the unrestricted current fund, mandatory transfers-out are to meet debt retirement requirements.

TRANSFERS OUT NON-MANDATORY – The movement of resources out of a fund for various purposes. In the unrestricted current fund, non-mandatory transfers-out are to supplement various auxiliary revenues, establish reserves, support plant funds, etc.



FY 2010-11 Priority Budget Issues Year-End (6/30/11) – Pre-Audit

CURRENT

GENERAL FUND

• Revenues:

Based on pre-audited financial statements total revenues exceeded the budget estimate for FY 2011 by \$5.4 million.

- Tuition and fee revenues ended the year greater than budgeted by \$2.3 million. A
 portion of these revenues was dedicated fees and was distributed to the
 departments of origination.
- o State Share of Instruction (SSI) fell short of budget by \$.9 million (or .8%).
- o It is important to note that \$15.1 million of the state appropriation was funded with federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds. These funds will no longer be available in FY12.
- Revenues from Departmental Sales and Services operations exceeded the FY11 budget by \$3.7 million – largely in Computer Solutions and the English Language Institute.
- o Investment income performed slightly better than anticipated with a favorable variance of about \$135,000 after booking of the unrealized net change in market value.

Expenses:

Total expenditures were below the budget estimate for FY 2011 by \$3.1 million after transferring \$8.7 million in health insurance under-spending to a new reserve fund.

- O Scholarships and fee remissions were greater than expected, primarily in the area of graduate assistant fee remissions.
- o Both Research and Public Service expenditures exceeded budget. Increased research expenditures were partially offset by indirect cost revenue. Increased expenditures in public service operations were more than offset by surplus revenues in sales operations.

• Transfers-out:

• \$6 million was transferred at year-end to a Budget Stabilization Reserve. These
funds will begin to provide financial security as we enter a period of reduced state
funding and a potential for the leveling off of enrollments.

- \$8.7 million was transferred to a Group Insurance Reserve. These funds represent the available budget dollars remaining after the implementation of the new selfinsured insurance plan. An appropriate reserve is critical to the success of this type of plan. Nonetheless, this reserve balance may be reduced to some extent, along with other carry-over balances to address the outstanding ERIP liability.
- o \$2.2 million in accumulated facility fees were transferred out to a reserve for future maintenance and repairs of the Student Union and the Student Recreation and Wellness Center.

AUXILIARIES

- o In aggregate, the auxiliaries operated in line with budget. The net operating surpluses generated just over \$55,000. The most profitable auxiliaries in FY11 were Dining Services and Telecommunications with operating surpluses of \$324,000 and \$359,000, respectively.
- o Shortages in football ticket sales were made up for with surpluses in scholarship funding. Another issue impacting Athletics was the increased costs associated with our many successes.

FY 11 Pre-Audit

FY11 Year-End

- While Akron total general fund resources exceeded projections by \$5.7 million, the total expenses were under budget by about \$3.1 million. The net change in fund balance (prior to final audit/adjustments) is \$4.3 million after recording all transfers in and out.
- Overall, Educational and General (E&G) spending is approximately 4% greater than in FY 2010.
- General fund expenditures in supplies and travel are greater than FY10 year-end spending by 2.3% and 5%, respectively.
- Student aid expenses are greater than last June by \$4.7 million (or 13%).

FY12 Planning

- The FY12 budget was approved by the Board of Trustees at its meeting on August 3rd and is based on three main principles of Capacity and Excellence Assurance, Strategic Investment, and Fiscal Integrity.
- Efforts are under way to address the details of the budgeted reductions and carryover balance adjustments.

Tultion & Fees - Tullion and General Fee revenues ore greater than budgeted as growth in credit hour production exceeded the budgeted levels by 1.4% in summer, 1% in the fall, and 1.6% in the spring. Overall, year-end sludent revenue exceeded the budget by \$2.3 million.

State Appropriations – The FY11
State Share of Instruction (SSI) is budgeted at \$105.6 million; however, the final State appropriation fell short of the annual budget by \$.9 million (or 821)

Departmental Sales and Workforce Development – Revenues in the sales and service areas and Workforce Development were greater than the annual budget by \$3.7 million. This variance was largely in the Computer Solutions (\$1.3 million), English Language Institute (\$.9 million), and Literacy Services (\$.5 million).


Indirect Cost Recovery – These revenues were 10% greater than budgeted through June. The receipts, which relate to externally funded grant activity, are based on the related spending and vary greatly from period to period.

Earnings from investments and Endowments – The earnings from investments and endowments exceeded the year-end budget by nearly \$.14 million. The returns on investments have improved and are expected to continue in this direction into the next fiscal year.

Miscellaneous income - The annual budget of \$1,050,000 relates to any income source that is not included in the above-referenced categories. The year-end miscellaneous revenue is largely from rental income from the Quaker Square retail spaces (\$365K) and \$158K in support of the Confucius Institute (from the China Ministry of Education).

Transfers-in – Transfers-in of \$3.1 million will cover open purchase orders from FY10. Institutional departmental corryover will be further analyzed and reported in the future.

Total Resources – In total, the FY11 pre-audit net available resources exceeded the budget by \$5.7 million (see Exhibit A5).



THE UNIVERSITY OF AKRON Unrestricted Current Fund Expenditures – Akron Campus Twelve-Month Period Ended 6/30/11 (Pre-Audit)

Introduction: The expenses in each of the functional categories are compared to the budget (see Exhibit A5) to reflect the FY11 spending against the approved budget. Through the end of FY11, total functional expenditures were \$3.1 million less than budgeted.

Instruction - All expenses in this category reflect the direct cost of providing instruction to the students. These expenses are primarily compensation at 93% of the total. Expenses within this function were less than budgeted by \$.6 million (or .5%). Throughout the fiscal year, this variance was much greater primarily in the group insurance area. As we completed the first six months of the


new, self-funded coverage, a surplus of \$8.7 million was transferred out to reserve for future claims. This contingency fund will provide stability in an area that is unpredictable.

Research – Through June, the activity in Research reflects an unfavorable spending variance of \$1.3 million (or 13.6%). This is partially offset by the year-end positive variance in indirect cost revenue. Variances in this function are primarily related to the timing of the activity in the research cost-sharing accounts and early activity in the various indirect cost accounts.

Public Service – The bulk of the activity in this area is related to soles accounts. Minimal favorable variances in Workforce Development net against the negative variance in Other Public Service operations to reflect an unfavorable variance of \$1.16 million (or -14.7%), in the Public Service function. The spending variances are more than offset by surplus revenues in the soles operations, such as Computer Solutions and the English Language Institute (ELI).

Academic Support - Spending in the Academic Support areas was less than budgeted by \$.17 million (or.5%). White library-related expenses exceeded projections by \$17,000, the remaining academic support operations were below June projections by \$192,000.

Student Services – Spending through June was in line with the annual budget as it ended just \$190,000 (or 1.7%) less than anticipated. The various student service operations have succeeded in providing the needed support for a growing number of students as enrollment has steadily increased over the past several years.



Institutional Support - Expenses of \$52.9 million were less than the budgeted \$59.6 million. This favoroble variance of \$6.7 million (or 11%), includes the Reserve for Bad Debt (last line of E&G dala) activity. The amount of bad debt written off in FY11 was \$1.37 million—against a budget of \$1.4 million.


Plant Operation & Maintenance - Activity in this function was slightly over budget (\$27,000, or .1%) through the end of FY11.

Scholarships — The results in the scholarship function are greater than budgeled. Fee remissions for graduate assistants exceeded the annual budget by around \$.5 million. Also, scholarships are awarded following a long-term altocation plan that relies on accumulated carryover balances. Overall scholarship expenses exceeded the annual budget by \$1.9 million (or 4.9%).

E&G Expenses by Pool – The following chart highlights the various E&G Expenses by pool. The variances in each area are based on a comparison of actual expenditures to an estimate of the portion of the budget that should be spent based on last year's trends. Please note that this data will vary greatly from period to period as budget transfers are processed each month. Funds are transferred throughout each period for various reasons, primarity to cover anticipated shortfalls. The Payroll budget variance is a result of the net effect of the \$3 million negative budget which reflects anticipated vacancy savings.



Restricted Expenditures by Type




Percentage of Completion by Type of Research Project (Active Projects)







Tullion & Fees — The FY10-11 tuilion & general fee budget is built based on \$1.8 million dollar increase in revenue. Although, the 12th month budget level shows an unfavorable variance of 5.9%, luition & general service fee revenue has increased from prior year 12th month budget level by \$805,200. Other Student Fees came in above the 12th month budget level by 16.6%

State Appropriations - FY11 State Appropriations came in below budget level by 2%.

Departmental Sales and Workforce Development – Revenues in the sales and service areas are above the 12th month budget level with a favorable variance of 21.7%.

Miscellaneous Income - Since a Wayne Auxiliary account was established to house revenue from Barnes & Noble, the Farmhouse rentals and other "student union" like activities, the miscellaneous income is only budgeted to receive revenue of \$2,000 for the liscal year. Year-to-date actual amount received for miscellaneous revenue is \$1,000.

Transfers-in – In addition to the revenue categories listed above, the FY11 annual budget also includes a transfers-in of \$50,000 from the contingency reserve. Transfers-in of \$3,182,751 and \$32,807 are related to departmental carryover and encumbrances.

Total Resources – In total, net available resources are below the 12th month budget level by 3.1%. When compared to prior year 12th month budget level actual total revenues increased \$927,000. Also, total revenues surpass expenditures by \$3.1 million. Revenue less expenditures and year-end closing Items will yield a carryover balance of \$2.1 million.

Introduction: The expenses in each of the functional categories are compared to the budget (see Exhibit W3) in an effort to reflect the year-to-date spending against the approved budget. In total, functional expenditures are less than the 12-month expenditure guideline by \$3 million.

Instruction – All expenses in this calegory reflect the direct cost of providing instruction to the students. The largest expense component is faculty compensation. Budget surpluses in this area are primarily related to the fact that all vacant positions for the college fall in this category.

Research - Research expenditures are below the 12- manth expenditure guideline by 52.5%.


Public Service – The activity in this area is related to Workforce Development & Continuing Education programs. These accounts experience timing variances, and it is not uncommon to see expense overages and revenue shortfalls.

Academic Support — Spending in the Academic Support areas is below the 12-month expenditure guideline by a total of \$90,500 (or 7.8%).

Student Services - Expenses in the Student Services function have a favorable variance of 3.4% at the 12-month expenditure level.

Institutional Support – Expenditures in this function are below the 12-month expenditure guideline with a favorable variance of 8.1%.

Plant Operation & Maintenance - Expenditures in this function have a favorable variance coming in at \$582,600 (or 29%) below the 12-month expenditure guideline.



Transfers-out – Year-end closing items include transfers-out in the amount of \$2 million to plant funds, \$1 million to scholarships, \$355,000 to subsequent year, and \$200,000 to insurance liability.

Total E & G – Overall. Educational & General expenditures are below the 12-month expenditure level with a favorable variance of 21.1%.

ADMINISTRATIVE FEE – The University levies an annual administrative fee of 1% of the market value of the pooled endowments in support of the Scholarship for Excellence Program. A deduction from principal, the administrative fee is one of the components of change in market value.

ASSET ALLOCATION - Each respective investment policy establishes an acceptable range and a target percentage of the portfolio's investment in the appropriate asset class.

BENCHMARK – A standard, used for comparison. For example, the S&P 500 may be used as a benchmark against which the performance of a blended large cap manager is compared. The performances of the University's operating and endowment investments are measured separately against appropriate benchmark indices.

DISTRIBUTIONS - The endowment's spending policy allows for an annual payout of 5% of the average market value of the pooled endowments for the prior three years to support current needs, primarily University scholarships. A deduction from principal, distributions are one of the components of change in market value.

ENDOWMENT FUNDS – Funds received from a donor with the restriction that the principal is not expendable. The principal is invested for the purpose of producing present and future income which may be expended or added to the principal. The majority of the University's endowment funds are commingled in a unitized investment pool allowing for broad diversification of investments,

GIFTS & TRANSFERS – Endowed gifts and bequests designated specifically to The University of Akron augment the University's endowments. An addition to principal, gifts and transfers are one of the components of change in market value.

INCOME – Gross income earned on the principal of endowment funds. This revenue is returned to principal to offset future distributions from the endowments in support of University scholarships. An addition to principal, income is one of the components of change in market value.

INVESTMENT INCOME – The revenue earned on the investments of operating funds. Investment income is a source of budgeted revenue for the University's general fund.

INVESTMENT POLICY – The University of Akron has two separate investment policies which have been adopted by its Board of Trustees. The investment policy that governs the Investment of operating funds is currently known as the Statement of Investment Objectives and Policy for The University of Akron Operating Funds. The investment policy that governs the investment of endowment funds is currently known as the Statement of Investment Policy for The University of Akron Endowment Funds.

INVESTMENT MANAGER – The managers have full discretion to invest the endowment assets under their management to best achieve the investment objectives set forth in the investment policy while complying with the guidelines and meeting the responsibilities imposed on them in the policy.

MARKET ADVANCE/(DECLINE) — The increase/(decrease) in the market value of the portfolio from the end of the last fiscal year to the present, after accounting for the other known components of change. Market advance/(decline) includes realized and unrealized gains/(losses).

MARKET VALUE – The portfolio's last reported sale price as determined dynamically by buyers and sellers in an open market.

OPERATING FUNDS — Included within the general fund, operating funds represent the total cash assets available for the operation of The University of Akron. The investment objective is to maximize the return on the operating cash balance consistent with assuring the safety of the portfolio's principal value while maintaining liquidity sufficient to meet reasonable anticipated expenses.

PORTFOLIO COMPOSITE — The portfolio composite is a time- and dollar-weighted rate of return incorporating the performance of all the managers (old and new) of the pooled endowments. The blended composite provides continuity regardless of changing managers and is measured against a blended benchmark provided by the University's investment consultant.

QUASI-ENDOWMENT FUNDS - Funds established by the University to function like an endowment fund but may be expended at any time at the discretion of the Board.

RATE OF RETURN – The rate of return on an investment expressed as a percentage of the total amount invested. Rates are generally reported over a combination of periods ending at the same time but with different beginning points in time (e.g., a quarter, trailing six-, nine-or twelve-month periods). On both investment reports rates are expressed net of fees.

SEPARATELY INVESTED ASSETS – Excluded from the investment pool, separate investment is sometimes necessary because of special provisions in the gift instrument or because of the nature of the gift property (e.g., life insurance policies).

TRUSTEES' FEES – Advisement, management and custodial fees assessed against the assets according to the market value of the endowment assets managed. A deduction from principal, trustee fees is one of the components of change in market value.

THE UNIVERSITY OF AKRON FOUNDATION – The University of Akron Foundation is a noi-for-profit organization operated for the benefit of The University of Akron. The Foundation's mission is to provide financial assistance to The University of Akron by encouraging and administering gifts and bequests. The Foundation's endowments are distinctly separate from the endowments administered by The University of Akron and are governed by a third investment policy adopted by the Foundation's Executive Committee.

Both fixed-income portfolios are well diversified among U.S. Treasuries. Federal Agencies and Corporate Notes. The composition of each portfolio is continually evaluated to capitalize on any market anomalies. During the fourth quarter, high quality corporate obligations offered good value: therefore, the corporate exposure in both portfolios was increased within the 40% maximum limit set by the University's Investment Policy. In the Short-Term Fixed Income portfolio, the allocation to Federal Agencies was increased while the allocation to U.S. Treasuries was decreased to pick up additional yield on the spreads. Over \$126 million in operating funds was invested in these two lixed-income portfolios as of June 30, 2011.

Cash and Cash Equivalents are maintained to meet daily liquidity needs. The high balance savings account at JPMChase Bank, which operates as a fully-funded cosh reserve with an annualized fixed yield of 0.15%, closed the fourth quarter with a \$38.5 million balance. In January 2011, excess cash in the University's PFM Prime Series money market account was used to purchase \$40 million in commercial paper maturing in May 2011. The returned cash was available to cover year-end expenditures, including debt service payments. The PFM Prime Series money market account closed the fourth quarter with a \$14.3 million balance. The outstanding cash assets are sufficient to cover University expenses throughout the summer until the next influx of revenue, which will colnicide with the beginning of Fall Semester 2011.

Interest rates across the yield curve fell during the fourth quarter on fears of an economic slowdown and, as a result, fixed-income portfolios with longer duralions posled strong positive returns.

With their highest quarterly returns in a year, longer-duration fixed-income portfolios significantly outperformed cash-equivalent portfolios, where returns remained near zero.

A defensive strategy with regard to benchmark durations and interest rate risks will continue to be employed during this volatile market.





The only new endowment in FY11 was a board-designated one named the Buchiel College of Aris and Sciences Scholarship Endowed fund, which was funded by the reallocation of English Language Institute revenues.

Total Distributions Distributions from endowments have been on the decline over the last three years because no distributions have been made from underwater endowments as identified during the annual scholorship projection colculations.

Market Advance/Decline
The market advance of FYTT has restored almost \$8.976 million in morket value to the University's endowment portfolio. For the periods ended June 30, 2011, the Portfolio Composite fell slightly below the Bolanced Index benchmark three out of the four postings: off by 57 basis points for the quarter; 54 basis points for the one-year period; and 26 for the five-year. Over the three-year period, the Portfolio Composite was calculated to be 39 basis points higher than the Balanced Index, 4,90% to 4.51% respectively.

On an individual basis, the managers' returns were single digit for the quarter, havering an both sides of zero isustrating the impact of the market downtum that began in May 2011. The strength of the economic recovery prior to May was evident in the double-digit returns for the one-year period for equity managers across the board. Systematic Financial posted a one-year net return of 39,99% which was 545 basis points before than the Russell 2500 Value benchmark. The lixed-income managers, PIMCO and MelWest, outperformed the Barclays Aggregate for the one-. Three-, and live-year periods.

The PIMCO AAAA fund reported its quarterly return at 36 basis points below its CPI +4% benchmork. The purpose of the multi-class fund is to smooth performance of the total particion. Historically, the Fund has displayed better averaged returns during quarters when equity performance was negative. The PIMCO AAAA Fund will begin to report one-year returns in the September 30, 2011, investment Report.

During the quarterly review meeting, Lagacy recommended that Artio Global remain "on wortch," given its three-year return was more than 200 basis points below the MSCI All World excluding US benchmark.

The following purchases for more than \$50,000 were granted a waiver of the competitive bidding requirement and are submitted for the information of the Board of Trustees at its meeting on September 21, 2011:

- Plumbing Work: The Vice President for Capital Planning and Facilities Management requested a waiver of the required competitive bidding process for the plumbing work associated with the First Energy Stadium restrooms in the anticipated cost of \$250,000. This waiver was due to the unique difficulties associated with maintaining an active construction site at a facility while the facility remained in use. Due to the nature and use of the facility (i.e. a stadium that regularly hosts athletic events drawing 3,000 to 4,000 attendees) an active construction site presented multiple risks, including open excavation, exposed electrical wires, construction materials and fall risks. Therefore, to avoid potential safety risks to spectators, this waiver of competitive bidding was reviewed and approved by the Department of Purchasing and the Office of General Counsel.
- 2. Electrical Work: The Vice President for Capital Planning and Facilities Management requested a waiver of the required competitive bidding process for the electrical work associated with the First Energy Stadium restrooms in the anticipated cost of \$200,000. This waiver was due to the unique difficulties associated with maintaining an active construction site at a facility while the facility remained in use. Due to the nature and use of the facility (i.e. a stadium that regularly hosts athletic events drawing 3,000 to 4,000 attendees) an active construction site presented multiple risks, including open excavation, exposed electrical wires, construction materials and fall risks. Therefore, to avoid potential safety risks to spectators, this waiver of competitive bidding was reviewed and approved by the Department of Purchasing and the Office of General Counsel.
- 3. Flooring Lighting and Painting Work: The Vice President for Capital Planning and Facilities Management requested a waiver of the required competitive bidding process for the flooring, lighting and painting work required at the Grant Street High Rise with a total

anticipated cost of \$115,800. This waiver was due to the imminent safety hazards to student move-in and occupancy for the fall semester.

- <u>Flooring.</u> Numerous missing tiles presented trip hazards. Worn, frayed and buckled carpeting posed trip hazards throughout the corridors and high traffic areas. The use of carts for fall move-in increased the risk posed under foot.
- <u>Lighting</u>. Low lighting levels exacerbated the safety risk for tripping and falling due to the flooring conditions.
- <u>Painting.</u> Students with allergies require sufficient off-gassing of paints and coatings
 prior to move in as a precaution against avoidable reactions. Traditional bidding of
 this portion of the work would not have permitted time for the coatings to fully cure
 before student occupancy.

This waiver of competitive bidding was reviewed and approved by the Department of Purchasing and the Office of General Counsel.









• Campus-wide Innovation: Golden Ideas



Golden Ideas is a robust online suggestion system that engages students in focused improvement initiatives called campaigns. The initial campaign, Student Success, concluded this summer. The Student Success Working Group is evaluating the 60 plus ideas to determine which should be presented to UA leadership for consideration.

The plan is to run a total of four campaigns throughout the Fall Semester. Two will be run simultaneously for two months (Sept/Oct), then another two campaigns will replace them for two months (Nov/Dec).

Topics for these campaigns are still being discussed, though the plan is to focus at least two, if not all, of them on student services issues. For example, we could explore the new student orientation process with incoming freshmen or we could look at accessibility issues. The project team's plan is to identify campaign topics from improvement ideas submitted to Golden Ideas during the summer.

Key to running the success of this project is identifying and recruiting sponsors who will take ownership of the idea/question/topic and commit resources to suggestions provided in the campaigns.

Lab Virtualization



The University is working to create a hosted, virtualized computer lab on the internet by October 2011.

In this plan, the University provides an "always on" remote hosted computer environment that enables students, faculty, staff, and contract professionals to gain access to software and tools necessary to accomplish its academic mission of education, teaching, and research from any location.

In the first phase of this project, a third party will provide internetbased applications that students wouldn't normally have access to without going to a computer lab.

The high-level goals for the project include:

- Provide virtualized computer lab environment that provide access from anywhere.
- Allow for "always on" remote.
- Reduce physical computer lab space.

Faculty Laptop Refresh











The Faculty Laptop Refresh committee has finalized and published (www.uakron.edu/it/laptop-refresh/index.dot) specifications for the new technology.

Developed with input from faculty members, the basic configuration of the new technology will be offered at no cost to departments. This configuration will meet the computing needs of most of the faculty.

An advanced configuration, featuring a faster processor, more memory, a larger monitor (Apple version only), and other enhancements will also be offered. If a faculty member selects this configuration, the department will pay the difference between the basic computer and this "advanced" option.

An RFP was issued to Fujitsu, Dell, Lenovo, HP (Gartner's Tier I vendors), and Apple on August 11. As of this writing, we are still awaiting responses, which are due August 26. Once responses are received, the committee will select a vendor and begin preparing documents for the Board of Trustees.

An abbreviated version of the projected timeline is as follows:

- Sept. 2: Issue Pre-Board of Trustees documentation/recommendation
- Sept. 5: Memo to Dean requesting laptop choices and distribution
- Sept. 13: Develop distribution list
- Sept. 13: Create draft requisitions and delivery schedule
- Sept. 21: Submit to Board of Trustees for approval
- Sept. 21: If approved, issue Purchase Order(s)
- Oct. 10: Receive first shipment
- Oct. 17: Begin deployment to faculty

This is part of t the Division's assessment team efforts with a primary goal to assist departments in improving the quality and sophistication of their assessment efforts and to coordinate a division-wide assessment plan. Results of the program quality assessment suggest that division employees learned a great deal and felt confident implementing what they learned in their department's assessment plans.

Career Services External Review and Site Visit

- As part of the University's goal to ensure optimal student success and
 effective management of the career development process, the Career
 Center hosted a consultant review of campus-wide career services,
 programs and delivery. Consultants Rosemary Hill of Ohio State
 University, Kelly Bishop of Michigan State University, and
 Marianna Savoca of SUNY Stony Brook visited campus June 13-15.
- Recommendations were received and plans are in place to address the accepted consultant recommendations to ensure optimal service to students, all colleges and their deans, employers and other stakeholders.

Office of International Programs

Open Doors Report

- UA reported to the Institute of International Education (IIE) for the Open Doors Report that 184 UA degree-seeking American students studied abroad for credit in 32 different countries from fall 2009 through summer 2010, an increase of 16 percent from the previous year.
- J-1 Exchange Visitor Annual Report made to U.S. Department of State
- The Exchange Visitor (J) non-immigrant visa category is for individuals approved to participate in work- and study-based exchange visitor programs. The Exchange Visitor Program fosters global understanding through educational and cultural exchanges.
- All exchange visitors are expected to return to their home countries upon completion of their programs in order to share their exchange experiences.
- For the period July 2010-June 2011, UA reported 133 J-1 records (or DS-2019 documents) were created, as well as 32 J-2 records (spouses and dependents). The J-1 records created included:

included comedian Buzz Sutherland, the RA Lip Sync, and Casino Night. The combined attendance for these three events was 3,648.

Summary of Rules Committee Agenda Items for the September 21, 2011 Meeting of the Board of Trustees

At a joint meeting of the Strategic Issues Committee and Rules Committee on September 12, 2011, it was recommended that revisions to the following Rules be considered for approval by the Board of Trustees at its regular meeting on September 21, 2011:

1. O.A.C. 3359-1-02 Officers of the Board and Their Duties

The revision to this Rule is proposed to allow the option for written minutes of committee meetings, when available, to constitute the complete record of minutes without the necessity of retaining the record.

2. O.A.C. 3359-1-03 Committees of the Board

The revisions to this Rule reflect the reconfiguration plan of the committees of the Board that was approved by the Board of Trustees at its June 15, 2011, meeting. In addition, the quorum provision is revised to match the proposed language for Rule 3359-1-04, and the "Internal Auditor" title is revised to reflect more current terminology and changes in reporting lines.

3. O.A.C. 3359-1-04 Meetings of the Board

The revisions to this Rule formally establish how a quorum shall be determined for various committee and Board meetings.

NOTE: Rules 3359-1-02, 3359-1-03, and 3359-1-04 are bylaws of the Board and require a 30-day notification in advance of consideration for adoption by the full Board at its regular meeting on September 21, 2011. Accordingly, these Rules were provided to all members of the Board of Trustees for their review on August 18 by email and on August 19 in print copy to satisfy this requirement.

4. O.A.C. 3359-3-01 Officers of Finance and Administration

Section (J) pertaining to the Internal Auditor is being removed from this Rule, as that position now reports to the Senior Vice President and Provost and Chief Operating Officer.

5. O.A.C. 3359-7-02 Office of University Internal Audit

The revisions to this Rule are proposed to reflect more current terminology for the "Internal Auditor" title and also reflect changes in reporting lines.

3359-1-02 Officers of the board and their duties.

(A) Officers.

The officers of the board shall be a chairperson and two vice chairpersons, who shall be members of the board, a secretary of the board, and an assistant secretary who need not be members of the board. The nominating committee shall meet annually in May, so that its report and recommendations may be voted upon at the board's regular meeting in June annually. The officers shall be elected at the board's regular meeting in June and shall take office at the first regular meeting of the board in each fiscal year beginning the first of July and shall serve until their successors are elected.

(B) Duties of officers.

The duties of the officers of the board shall be as follows:

(1) Chairperson.

- (a) The chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the board and shall decide all questions of order. It shall be the chairperson's duty to see that the bylaws of the board are complied with; that the duties of the executive officers of the university, as prescribed in the regulations of the board, are followed; and that the resolutions and documents of the board are properly executed. The chairperson shall be an ex-officio member of all committees of the board.
- (b) The chairperson shall, for and on behalf of the university and the board, sign instruments, contracts, minutes, resolutions, diplomas, and other documents authorized by the board, or authorize the president of the university or the secretary to so act in the chairperson's behalf.
- (c) The chairperson shall perform such other duties as these bylaws shall hereinafter prescribe or as may be, from time to time, delegated to the chairperson by the board.

(2) Vice chairpersons.

During the absence of the chairperson, a vice chairperson designated by the chairperson shall be invested with the powers and discharge the duties of the chairperson. Should the chairperson fail or be unable to make a designation, the vice chairperson with the most seniority as vice chairperson shall act as chairperson during the chairperson's absence or incapacitation. Should both vice chairpersons have equal seniority as vice chairpersons, the vice chairperson with the most seniority as a board member shall act as chairperson.

(3) Secretary.

- (a) The secretary, as an officer of the board, shall be the custodian of the seal of the university of Akron, of all records, books, deeds, contracts, documents and papers of the board. The secretary shall attest by signing all instruments, contracts, diplomas, certificates, and other documents executed on behalf and in the name of the university and the board by the chairperson of the board and/or the president of the university, and shall have contract authority with respect to the execution of contracts as authorized by the board of trustees or as provided in the rules of the board of trustees.
- (b) The secretary shall attend all meetings of the board and committees of the board and shall keep accurate and complete records of minutes of said meetings in a manner consistent with the requirements of Ohio law respecting the records of public meetings. In implementing this requirement with respect to regular or special meetings of the board, such meetings shall be mechanically recorded and thereafter reduced to writing with the aid and benefit of such recordings. The written minutes shall be submitted for formal approval by the board of trustees to ensure that such minutes are accurate and complete in memorializing the proceedings, decisions, and actions of the board in such meetings. Upon approval of the minutes by the board of trustees, the mechanical recordings shall no longer be required to be kept.

Minutes of the meetings of committees of the board shall also be mechanically recorded, but inasmuch as committees of the board are not authorized to act on behalf of the board of trustees, such mechanical recordings shall constitute the complete record of minutes of said meetings, without the necessity of being reduced to writing or otherwise require formal approval by the respective committee. However, in the event such committee meeting minutes are reduced to writing, then such minutes shall constitute the complete record of minutes of said committee meeting without the necessity of retention of the mechanical recording of such meeting. Such recordings shall be kept according to the applicable records retention schedule. The secretary shall, prior to consideration by the board of approval of the record of any meeting, transmit by mail or deliver to each member a copy of the written record of the regular or special meeting and shall give notice to the members of the board and to the president of the university of all meetings of the board, both regular or special; and, when requested by the chairperson of any committee of the board, shall give notice of the meeting of such committee to the members thereof.

(c) When elected thereto by the board, the secretary may, if not a member of the board, occupy an administrative position in the university, in addition to being an officer of the board. Otherwise, the secretary, when elected thereto by the board, shall be made an unclassified contract professional employee of the university and shall hold office and be employed thereafter at the sole discretion of the board, and pursuant to terms and conditions established by the board. The secretary shall report directly to the board through the chairperson of the board, and shall work in close cooperation and coordination with the president. This reporting arrangement shall not preclude the right of trustees and the secretary to communicate directly with the other at any time on all matters the board, individual trustees, or chairperson shall require.

(d) The secretary, with the assistance of the assistant secretary, shall provide for a system of filing university rules in compliance with Chapter 111. of the Revised Code. The secretary shall only file those rules properly promulgated by the board of trustees and the faculty senate, in accordance with the bylaws and regulations of the board of trustees. The secretary, at the direction of the vice president and general counsel, shall be authorized to make such changes to university rules as are necessary to comply with the requirements of law, rule filing requirements by the secretary of state or other legislative agency, provide for consistency in related rules, and avoid duplication and unintended consequences of grammatical or other stylistic provisions in the rules.

(e) The secretary shall receive and respond to routine correspondence, inquiries, and requests to the board of trustees, with the copies thereof to the chairperson. The secretary shall receive all transmittals to the members of the board of trustees and shall be responsible for providing copies of same to individual board members. Proposals from faculty and staff, either as a group or as individuals, shall be referred to the president pursuant to paragraph (B) of rule 3359-1-05 of the Administrative Code, with a copy thereof to the chairperson. Requests to address the board or any committee of the board shall not normally be considered unless submitted in writing to the secretary at least two weeks prior to any regularly scheduled meeting. Such requests shall include information requested by the secretary, including, but not limited to, the purpose of the request and a summary of the topic to be addressed. The chairperson of the board, in consultation with the chairperson of any committee of the board, as appropriate, shall, for and on behalf of the board or committee, determine if and when the matter should be scheduled upon the agenda of the board or committee of the board. In the event the chairperson determines not to schedule the matter on the agenda of the board or committee of the board, the chairperson shall direct the secretary to provide notice of such request to members of the board for their information.

(f) The secretary shall confer with each member of the board of trustees concerning the procedure each trustee prefers regarding receipt of anonymous transmittals. Individual trustees may direct the secretary in writing to retain their copies of anonymous transmittals for reference in the board office. Otherwise, the secretary shall forward such transmittals by regular mail or personal delivery. Such transmittals shall not be delivered by facsimile copy.

(4) Assistant secretary.

- (a) When elected thereto by the board, the assistant secretary shall also be made an unclassified contract professional employee of the university and shall hold office and be employed thereafter at the sole discretion of the board, and pursuant to the terms and conditions established by the board. The assistant secretary shall report to the chairperson of the board of trustees on those matters assigned by the chairperson or board of trustees, and to the secretary on those matters and duties prescribed within the responsibility of the secretary. The assistant secretary shall work in close cooperation and coordination with both the president and the secretary of the board. The assistant secretary shall assist the secretary in the execution of duties outlined in these rules for the secretary, and shall substitute in the secretary's absence. This reporting arrangement shall not preclude the right of trustees and the assistant secretary to communicate directly with the other at any time.
- (b) The responsibilities of the assistant secretary shall be assigned by the chairperson of the board and shall include, but not be limited to, the daily management of the board office and operations, direct oversight of board communications, coordination of trustee development and strategic planning initiatives as directed by the chairperson of the board or committee chairs, serve as board liaison in connection with major university initiatives and with campus, community, governmental, or other constituencies as directed by the chairperson of the board.

(c) The assistant secretary shall attend all meetings of the board and committees of the board and shall assist members of the board as they may request in carrying out their fiduciary duties to the board.

Pertaining to Revisions to University Rule 3359-1-02 Officers of the Board and Their Duties

BE IT RESOLVED, that the recommendation presented by the Committee on Rules concerning the approval of the revisions to University Rule 3359-1-02, be approved.

3359-1-03 Committees of the board.

(A) Standing committees.

The members, and chairperson and, if deemed necessary or desirable, vice chairperson(s) of each standing committee shall be appointed annually by the chairperson of the board. Each such committee shall be self-governed and may subdivide its work among subcommittees and perform its functions in such manner as the committee deems advisable. It may initiate proposals or act on proposals delegated to it by the board, or made to it by the board chairperson or president of the university, and shall make recommendations to the board for action. The functions of the standing committees, including such special duties as may be delegated by the board, shall in general be as follows:

- (1) Educational-policy/student-affairs-committee Academic issues & student success committee.
 - (a) Consider and make recommendations concerning all policy matters requiring attention or action of the board relating to:
 - <u>F</u>faculty appointment, tenure, and status; academic planning and governance and educational policies; areas of instruction and degree programs; areas of research and related activities; student admissions; and other matters of policy governing or pertaining to academic and curricular affairs;
 - (ii) consider and make-recommendations concerning all policy matters requiring attention or action of the board relating to Sstudent affairs and student life engagement and success including enrollment services, advising and counseling, academic support programs, student development and conduct, student financial aid and scholarships, internships, student assistantships, intercollegiate athletics and other non-academic matters affecting students.
 - (iii) Alumni structures, strategies and policies, including the promotion of relations with the university's

alumni.

- (iv) Communication and marketing strategies, including positioning in rankings.
- (2) <u>Finance</u>, <u>fiscal-policy</u>, <u>and-investment-committee</u> <u>Finance</u> & <u>administration committee</u>.
 - (a) Consider and make recommendations concerning all policy matters requiring attention or action of the board relating to:
 - (i) The university budget and financial operations, as well as budget alignment with academic objectives and priorities, business organization and practice; the capital budget and plan; personnel appointments, changes of status, salary adjustments, and other personnel changes; placing and renewal of all insurance; borrowing of funds and issuance of bonds and notes; student tuition, fees, and other sources of university income; custody and investment of any funds which are now under or may in the future come under control of the board of trustees;
 - (ii) Institutional fiscal health indicators, including senate bill 6 and measures of the higher learning commission of the north central association of colleges and schools.
 - (iii) Submission of appropriation requests; and other such matters, except for those recommendations which are within the purview of the facilities planning and oversight committee and which include, but are not limited to, those recommendations of the facilities planning and oversight committee that involve the expenditure or commitment of funds related to capital planning and capital projects for the university, as well as facilities' quality and use for the academic mission; the location, planning, construction, renovation,

demolition and maintenance of the university's physical plant, streets, grounds and capital equipment; the purchase, sale, and lease of real estate; the procedure for implementation of locally administered projects, and for the selection process for architects, engineers, construction managers and contractors.

- (iv) Solicitation of funds for present and future needs of the university; development policies and investments to support academic priorities; coordination of activities with the university of Akron foundation; the naming of buildings and other honorary designations; and relations with local, state and federal legislative and administrative agencies.
- (v) The preparation, conduct, or review of negotiations or bargaining sessions with bargaining agents for university employees concerning their compensation or other terms or conditions of employment.
- (b) This committee shall constitute the board's "investment committee" as required by section 3345.05 of the Revised Code, and shall be authorized to exercise that authority and responsibility provided by law for the investment committee.

(3) External affairs committee.

(a) Consider and make recommendations concerning all-policy matters requiring attention or action of the board relating to solicitation of funds for present and future needs of the university; coordination of activities with the university of Akron-foundation; relations with local, state, and federal legislative and administrative agencies; and the promotion of relations with the university's alumni and alumni association; consider and make recommendations concerning the naming of buildings and other similar honorary designations.

(4) Facilities planning and oversight committee.

Consider and make recommendations to the board of trustees regarding the capital planning and capital projects for—the—university, including—the—overall—campus development—guide plan; consider—and—make recommendations—regarding—the—location;—planning; construction, renovation, demolition and maintenance of the university's physical-plant, streets, grounds, and capital equipment;-consider-and-make-recommendations-regarding the purchase, sale, and lease of real estate; make recommendations regarding—the procedure for implementation of locally administered projects, and for the selection-process-for-architects,-engineers,-construction managers, and contractors; make recommendations regarding-biennium-capital-appropriation-requests-and-the expenditure-or-commitment-of-funds-related-to-capital planning and capital-projects for the university.

(5)(3) Strategic issues committee.

- (a) Consider and make recommendations concerning the strategic position of the university and the strategic issues and priorities that, from time to time, require the board's focused attention. Such issues shall be assigned to the committee by the chairperson of the board and reflect areas critical to the successful performance of the institution's mission. In making assignments, the chairperson of the board shall avoid unnecessary duplication with other standing committees.
- (b) Collect and analyze data utilizing, when appropriate, comparisons, trends, goals and objectives, trend analysis, market comparisons, peer comparisons, norm comparisons, environmental comparisons, impact analysis, projections and forecasts, resource allocation models, presentation methods, and other similar measures.
- (c) Identify and, from time to time, inform the board and make recommendations with respect to local, state, national and

- international issues involving higher education and their potential impact upon the university of Akron.
- (d) Coordinate with the chairperson of the board the regular and structured delivery of reports to and reviews by the board of trustees from the administration through information sessions, executive sessions, and regular or special meetings of the board of trustees, as appropriate.

 Unless provided within the purview of another standing or special committee of the board, the subject matters of such reviews may include, but shall not be limited to; (i) legal reviews; (ii) health, safety and environmental reviews for all-property owned, leased, or operated by the university; (iii) intellectual property, technology transfer and entrepreneurial activity reviews; (iv) affiliated entity reviews—(v)—compliance—reviews; and—(vi)—corporate governance, fiduciary and conflicts reviews.
- (e) <u>Identify, prioritize and assign projects related to strategic issues to other committees of the board as appropriate.</u>
- **(f)** Consider and make recommendations to the board concerning the organization of the board and the individual involvement and fiduciary and legal role of trustees; the bylaws regarding the operation of the board and its committees; the board's operation and matters related to board and trustee assessment, trustee selection and trustee orientation; the expectation of trustees' comportment within the board and with the president and internal and external constituencies; the avoidance of conflict of interest or commitment or the appearance of same; board size, composition and organization; calendaring of university events for the board, its committees and individual trustees (including commencement); trustee roles and learning and professional development for trustees; a community business collaboration policy; and other matters assigned by the board or the chair of the board.

(6)(4) Rules committee.

(a) Consider and make recommendations concerning the adoption, amendment, and repeal of rules of the university required to be filed with the secretary of state. Such rules shall include but not be limited to, (i) any rule, regulation, bylaw, or standard adopted by the board of trustees, or pursuant to their rule-making authority; and, (ii) any rule, regulation, bylaw, or standard which has a general and uniform effect when applied to students, faculty, staff, or the general public, or to any identifiable class of students, faculty, staff, or the general public.

(7)(5) Audit & compliance committee.

- (a) The primary responsibility of the audit & compliance committee is to provide oversight of the university's financial practices, compliance policies, internal controls, financial management, and standards of conduct.
- The chairperson of the university of Akron board of (b) trustees shall appoint the members and chairperson of the audit & compliance committee, which shall be comprised of five members of the board. The audit & compliance committee chairperson shall be one of these five members. The board chairperson shall be an ex-officio member of the audit & compliance committee who has the right, but not the obligation, to participate and vote in the proceedings of the committee, but is not counted in determining the number required for a quorum unless fewer than three voting members of the audit & compliance committee are present, in which case the chairperson may be counted for purposes of establishing a quorum or whether a quorum is present at a meeting. In making appointments to the audit & compliance committee, the chairperson of the board of trustees shall attempt to provide for reasonable continuity such that annually the committee includes one or more members who have had previous service on the audit & compliance committee.
- (c) Definition. "Independent" shall refer to a person who, other than in his or her capacity as a member of the audit &

<u>compliance</u> committee, the board of trustees, or any other board committee:

- (i) Does not accept any consulting, advisory, or other compensatory fee from the university, its related entities, or its external <u>auditor(s)</u>, <u>unless consistent</u> with the requirements, <u>limitations</u>, and <u>prohibitions</u> of the Ohio ethics law; and
- (ii) Has not accepted such compensation at any time in the year preceding the member's appointment to the audit & compliance committee, unless consistent with the requirements, limitations, and prohibitions of the Ohio ethics law.
- (d) Eligibility. Each member of the audit & compliance committee shall be a voting member of the board and shall be independent.
- (e) Consultants. The audit & compliance committee may obtain counsel, financial experts, or other expertise to advise the committee, or to assist in the conduct of an investigation. The audit & compliance committee may enlist the assistance of the university's administrators and employees as needed.
- (f) Review. The audit & compliance committee shall review and reassess this rule annually and recommend any proposed changes to the board, including changes that it deems to be necessary as a result of its work and/or new laws or regulations.
- (g) Meetings. The audit & compliance committee shall meet at least twice per year. The audit & compliance committee may ask members of the university administration or others to attend its meetings and provide pertinent information as necessary.
- (h) Executive sessions. The audit & compliance committee may conduct audit conferences as provided by law and may conduct executive sessions with the university's outside

auditors, its general counsel, or outside counsel, or anyone else as desired by the audit & compliance committee and permitted by the Ohio "open meetings act."

- (i) Responsibilities. The audit & compliance committee shall:
 - Internal-auditor Chief audit executive. Review and (i) the appointment, replacement, concur in reassignment, or dismissal of the internal-auditor chief audit executive, who shall have a dual reporting responsibility to the vice-president-for finance-and-administration-and-chief-financial officer ("CFO") senior vice president, provost and chief operating officer (COO) and to the audit & compliance committee. The audit & compliance committee shall follow the guidance of the Institute of Internal Auditors Practice Advisory 1110-2 with respect to the distinction between functional and administrative reporting and shall develop and recommend for approval by the board of trustees for inclusion in this rule, those circumstances in which the university internal auditor chief audit executive shall report directly to the audit & compliance committee of the board of trustees, without prior or subsequent reporting to any institutional officer.
 - (ii) Selection/retention of outside auditors. Recommend appointment of the outside auditors to be engaged by the university and which auditors shall report to the board through the audit & compliance committee, establish the audit fees of the outside auditors, and pre-approve any non-audit services provided by the outside auditors before the services are rendered. In general, the outside auditors may provide non-audit services to the extent that they are not auditing their own work, fulfilling the university administration's role, or advocating externally for the university.
 - (iii) Evaluation of outside auditors. Review and evaluate the performance of the outside auditors and

review with the full board any proposed discharge by the audit & compliance committee of the outside auditors.

- (iv) Duration of audit partners. Ascertain that the lead or concurring audit partner, as well as any partner other than the lead or concurring partner, from the outside auditors serves in such capacity for a period of reasonable duration, consistent with then best practices for non-profit entities.
- (v) Communications with outside auditors. Review all material written communications between the outside auditors and university administrators, such as any management <u>letter</u>, <u>schedule of findings</u>, or schedule of unadjusted differences.
- (vi) Risks. Inquire of university administrators, the internal—auditor chief audit executive, and the outside auditors about significant risks or exposures facing the university; assess the steps the university administration has taken or proposes to take to minimize such risks to the university; and periodically review compliance with such steps.
- (vii) Audit function. Review with the <u>university's</u> <u>administrators and the</u> outside auditors, the vice president for finance and administration and "CFO," and the <u>internal auditor chief audit executive</u>, the audit scope and plans of the <u>internal auditor chief audit executive</u> and the outside auditors; and address the coordination of audit efforts to assure the completeness of coverage, reduction of redundant efforts, and the effective use of the audit resources.
- (viii) Internal reviews. Conduct internal reviews by reviewing with the university administration and the internal auditor chief audit executive:
 - (a) Significant findings on internal audits during

- the year and the university administration's responses thereto;
- (b) Any difficulties the internal audit team encountered in the course of their audits, including any restrictions on the scope of their work or access to required information;
- (c) Any changes required in the scope of their internal audit;
- (d) The internal auditing department office budget and staffing;
- (e) The internal auditing department office charter; and
- (f) Policies and procedures with respect to officers' expense accounts and perquisites, including their use of eorporate university assets and any available review of these areas.
- (ix) Controls. Review with the outside auditors and the internal auditor chief audit executive:
 - (a) The adequacy of the university's internal controls including computerized information system controls and security; and
 - (b) Any related significant findings and recommendations of the outside auditors and internal audit—services auditing office together with the university's responses thereto.
- (x) Laws and regulations. Review with the general counsel and the internal auditor chief audit executive legal and regulatory matters that, in the opinion of university administrators, may have a material impact on the financial statements, related

- university compliance policies, and programs and reports received from regulators.
- (xi) Financial statements. Review with the university's administrators and the outside auditors:
 - (a) The university's annual financial statements and related footnotes;
 - (b) The outside auditors' audit of the financial statements and their reports thereon;
 - (c) Any significant changes required in or indicated for the outside auditors' audit plan; and
 - (d) Any serious difficulties or disputes with the university's administrators which are encountered during the audit.
- (xii) Codes of conduct. Periodically review applicable federal and state laws regarding codes of conduct and similar compliance requirements and standards, including, but not limited to, the university's conflict of interest, conflict of commitment, scholarly misconduct, and ethical conduct policies and procedures located in rule 3359-11-17 of the Administrative Code, to ensure that they are adequate and up-to-date, easy to access and understand, widely communicated, clear as to how to report concerns or ask questions, and complete with a conflict of interest policy; and review with the internal-auditor chief audit executive and the general counsel the results of their monitoring of compliance of such policies and procedures.
- (xiii) Alerts. Review procedures for the receipt of information, anonymous or otherwise, raising concerns regarding questionable accounting or auditing matters or wrongdoing, and review any submissions that have been received, the current

status, and the resolution, if one has been reached.

- (xiv) Compliance. Coordinate with the chairperson of the board the regular and structured delivery of reports to and reviews by the board of trustees from the administration through information sessions, executive sessions, and regular or special meetings of the board of trustees, as appropriate on subject matters that may include, but shall not be limited to:
 - (a) <u>legal reviews</u>;
 - (b) health, safety and environmental reviews for all property owned, leased, or operated by the university.
 - <u>intellectual property, technology transfer</u> and entrepreneurial activity reviews;
 - (d) affiliated entity reviews;
 - (e) compliance reviews; and
 - <u>(f)</u> <u>corporate governance, fiduciary and conflict</u> reviews.
- (xiv)(xv)General. Perform such other functions as may be required by law, the university of Akron board of trustees' bylaws, or the university of Akron board of trustees.
- (j) Reporting. The audit & compliance committee shall regularly apprise the board of its activities and recommendations.

3359-1-04 Meetings of the board.

(A) Meetings.

- (1) Regular meetings shall be held in accordance with meeting schedules adopted and, from time to time, amended by a vote of the majority of the board. The time and place of meetings shall be set by the board.
- (2) Special meetings shall be called by the secretary upon the request of the chairperson or any two members of the board on not less than five days' notice. Emergency meetings may be called by the secretary upon request of the chairperson in accord with the provisions of Ohio law respecting public meetings.
- (3) Unless otherwise specifically stated in the notice of the meeting, any business may be transacted at any meeting of the board.
- (4) All regular, special, emergency, committee meetings, and executive sessions of the board shall be held in conformance with the requirements of Ohio law governing public meetings. Public meetings shall not include attendance by a majority of board members of the board or a majority of board members of any committee or subcommittee of the board at information sessions, campus events, social or other activities which do not involve a prearranged discussion of university business by such members of the board.

(B) Quorum.

- (1) For all regular, special, and emergency meetings of the board, a A majority of the board, when duly convened, shall constitute a quorum as provided in section 3359.01 of the Revised Code.
- (2) For committee meetings of the board, any three voting members of the committee shall constitute a quorum; and when such quorum is established in this manner, only those voting members of the committee may vote upon recommendations of the committee.
 - (a) In the event fewer than three voting members of a committee shall be present, the quorum may be established

with at least one voting member of the committee plus any two additional voting members of the board of trustees who shall be in attendance at the committee meeting. When quorum is established in this manner, all voting members of the board of trustees present at such committee meeting shall be entitled to vote upon recommendations of the committee.

(b) All members of the board of trustees may attend any meeting of any committee of the board of trustees.

(C) Order of business.

Unless otherwise ordered by the chairperson, the usual order of business at regular meetings shall be as follows:

- (1) Call to order.
- (2) Report of the chairperson.
- (3) Report of the president.
- (4) Consideration of minutes of previous meeting(s).
- (5) Consideration of recommendations of standing committees.
- (6) Report of special, advisory or other committees.
- (7) Unfinished business.
- (8) New and miscellaneous business.
- (9) Special presentation(s).
- (10) Adjournment.

(D) Rules of Order.

The most current edition of "Robert's Rules of Order" shall be accepted as authority on all questions of parliamentary procedure not determined by

these bylaws. Any motion shall be reduced to writing upon request of a member. The chairperson shall have authority to rule on all questions of order and answer parliamentary inquiries. The chairperson may appoint a parliamentarian, who may or may not be a member of the board, to consult with and advise the chairperson, other officers, committees, and members on matters of parliamentary procedure. However, the chairperson has a duty to make a final ruling on all questions of order and, in doing so, has the right to follow the advice of the parliamentarian, or to disregard it.

3359-3-01 Officers of finance and administration.

- (A) The president of the university, as specified in rule 3359-1-05 of the Administrative Code, the president is executive head of all university colleges and departments possessing duties, responsibilities and powers as delineated in the bylaws.
- (B) Vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
 - (1) The vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer shall be appointed by the board upon recommendation of the president, shall hold office at the discretion of the president, and shall be responsible to the president.

Notwithstanding the direct reporting relation between the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer to the president, it shall be the duty and responsibility of the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer to coordinate with and keep the senior vice president and provost and chief operating officer informed in advance on all matters, initiatives, or decisions within their area of responsibility that involve academic matters, or that have a reasonable expectation of involving or affecting the academic programs, activities, or directions of the university.

- (2) The vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer shall be responsible for the supervision and administration of functions encompassed by the division of finance and administration, including all fiscal operations, financial planning and budgeting, treasury services, student financial services, labor relations, human resources, purchasing, Hower house, parking services, dining services, telecommunications and other auxiliary services.
- (3) The vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer shall be responsible for the financial administration of the university including budgeting; the collection, deposit, and disbursement of all funds; purchasing and risk management; central stores; insurance plans of the university; and the development of budgets for auxiliaries operated by others, such as the E. J. Thomas performing arts hall, university housing, rubber bowl, athletics, and the student union.

- (4) The associate vice president for treasury and financial planning shall be responsible for financial analysis and development of resource opportunities.
- (5) The associate vice president for treasury and financial planning shall assist the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer by performing those duties as may be assigned by the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
- (D) Associate vice president/controller.
 - (1) The associate vice president/controller shall be appointed by the board upon recommendation of the president, shall hold office at the discretion of the president, and shall be responsible to the president through the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
 - (2) The associate vice president/controller shall be responsible to the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer for the administration of the functions encompassed by the separate areas of purchasing, student accounts/bursar, and the controller.
 - (3) The associate vice president/controller shall maintain accounting records, on a consistent basis, in which all funds, accounts, receipts, expenditures, and financial matters of the university shall be entered and posted in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles, so as to show fully and clearly at all times

the financial condition of the university.

- (4) The associate vice president/controller shall keep an inventory of all university property used for instructional, research, and residential purposes, and statistics as to the use thereof, and its condition.
- (5) The associate vice president/controller shall prepare periodic financial reports for presentation to the board by the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer and shall also prepare periodic financial reports for presentation to various state and federal agencies, as required by state and federal agencies.
- (6) The associate vice president/controller shall be responsible for the receipt of and disbursing of all funds, and shall assist the treasurer in the investment of all available current funds.
- (7) The associate vice president/controller shall perform other duties as may be assigned by the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.

(E) Director of purchasing.

- (1) The director of purchasing shall be appointed by the board upon the recommendation of the president and shall hold office at the discretion of the president. The director of purchasing shall be responsible to the president through the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
- (2) The director of purchasing conducts routine purchasing, accounting, and budget control transactions in accordance with good business practice and, where applicable, the regulations of the state of Ohio. The purchasing procedures to be followed shall be:
 - (a) Contracts involving the expenditures of money within the limits fixed by board appropriation may be made on behalf of the university by the president, vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer, director of purchasing, or senior vice president and provost and chief operating officer, within the scope of their authority, as set

forth in the bylaws and regulations of the board.

- (b) The dean of the university libraries and the law librarian may make contracts for the purchase of library books and periodicals and to execute license agreements for additional library resources, within their budgets for the respective libraries.
- (c) The director of E. J. Thomas performing arts hall may purchase the services of performing artists and enter into contracts with these artists on behalf of the university. The athletic director may execute contracts with other colleges and universities for intercollegiate athletic events.
- (d) Purchases shall be made on forms containing certificates indicating the tax exempt status of the university.
- (e) A competitive bid process and/or a negotiation process, as approved by the director of purchasing and the office of general counsel, shall be utilized in all cases where the goods to be purchased shall cost in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars or services to be purchased shall cost in excess of fifty thousand dollars, and contracts for the purchase of such goods or services shall be awarded in accordance with established university procedures.
- (f) Any purchase of goods that cost less than twenty-five thousand dollars or services that cost less than fifty thousand dollars may be submitted to vendors for competitive bidding. In determining whether competitive bidding and/or negotiations shall be appropriate, the director of purchasing shall consider the availability of source of materials or services or whether timely quotations for such materials or services are already available. The foregoing requirements for competitive bidding shall not apply to:
 - (i) the purchase of stock for purposes of resale in campus stores;
 - (ii) the purchase of books or publications for the campus libraries;

- (iii) situations involving emergencies;
- (iv) the purchase of proprietary goods or services that are only available from a sole source;
- (v) professional contracted services;
- (vi) the purchase of goods or services from vendors covered by consortium group contracts such as the state of Ohio, inter-university council of Ohio (IUC), and community, university, and educational cooperative and purchasing association (CUE); or
- (vii) any approved negotiation processes.

The director of purchasing shall take full advantage of state of Ohio contracts with suppliers negotiated by the Ohio department of administrative services, state purchasing department. The director of purchasing shall also make efficient use of the inter-university council purchasing contracts and other cooperative purchasing association contracts available to state universities.

(g) Any purchase of construction services in excess of fifty thousand dollars must be by competitive bid. For construction services in excess of fifty thousand dollars, a request for competitive bid must be advertised in a newspaper of general circulation and/or other electronic means approved by the director of purchasing.

The limitations provided in this authority shall not be avoided through multiple purchases of goods or services under the limits authorized or through aggregations or purchases at the same or different times.

(h) Any purchase of goods or services in excess of three hundred fifty thousand dollars, except for subcontracts issued through externally funded research grants and contracts for which the university is the grantee, shall be submitted to the board for prior approval. All purchases of goods in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars and services in excess of fifty thousand dollars, but less than three hundred fifty thousand dollars, including all subcontracts through externally funded grants, shall be reported to the board.

Except where prohibited by law, competitive bidding requirements of the university may be waived under limited and exceptional circumstances. Exceptional circumstances which warrant the waiver of competitive bidding include, but are not limited to, responding to emergencies resulting from fire, flood, freezing, or other acts of God or force majeure, situations in which it may reasonably be determined by a prudent person standard that there is substantial financial or other risk or substantial financial or other opportunity to the university such that the risk or opportunity clearly warrants waiver, as well as emergencies necessitated by the immediate need to comply with laws or regulations affecting persons or property owned, leased, or operated by the university.

In order to implement the procedure to waive competitive bidding, the appropriate vice president must provide such request for waiver to the director of purchasing in advance with a written certification by the vice president as to the rationale supporting the need to waive competitive bidding. The director of purchasing shall review all requests for waiver with the office of general counsel, and the director of purchasing shall make the final decision as to whether the waiver shall be authorized based on the guidelines in this rule.

Purchases resulting from the waiver of competitive bidding shall be separately identified in the vendor reports provided to the board of trustees at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the board of trustees. In no event shall the director of purchasing waive competitive bidding for any purchase in excess of three hundred fifty-thousand dollars.

The limitations provided in this authority shall not be avoided through multiple purchases of goods or services under the limits authorized or through aggregations or purchases at the same or different times.

- (i) The director of purchasing shall search for new vendors and contractors, especially vendors and contractors owned and operated by individuals categorized as minorities, and shall honor state laws concerning purchasing set aside rules favoring minorities, and shall communicate to others on campus the desirability of using minority vendors.
- (j) The purchase of insurance occasionally can be more economical and efficient through direct placement rather than competitive bid. In such instances, the trustees must be notified of action taken and the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer shall report why the purchase was done by direct placement rather than through competitive bid.
- (k) The director of purchasing shall perform other duties as assigned by the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
- (l) The director of purchasing shall establish a travel program for all employees at the university of Akron, which will provide for consistency with all university rules and practices and prohibitions that are not consistent with such program. Such program shall be subject to review and approval by the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer and the vice president and general counsel.

(F) Treasurer.

- (1) The treasurer shall be appointed by the board upon recommendation of the president, shall hold office at the discretion of the president and shall be responsible to the president through the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
- (2) The treasurer shall be responsible for coordinating activities with portfolio managers appointed by the board and evaluating endowment fund investment performance based on board policies.
- (3) The treasurer shall be responsible for the management and investment of operating funds, including the monitoring of

investment managers and overseeing their compliance with board policy concerning securities, quality constraints, and maturity guidelines as well as recommending modifications to the strategic policies.

- (4) The treasurer shall prepare periodic financial reports on endowment and operating funds for presentation to the board by the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
- (5) The treasurer shall be responsible for relations with financial institutions and for soliciting and evaluating general banking services.
- (6) The treasurer shall assist in the evaluation of capital asset financing alternatives through bonds, notes, leases, or by other means.
- (7) The treasurer shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
- (G) Director of the office of resource analysis and budget.
 - (1) The director of the office of resource analysis and budget shall be appointed by the board upon recommendation of the president, shall hold office at the discretion of the president, and shall be responsible to the president through the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
 - (2) The supports the annual development of the general fund and auxiliary budgets for both the Akron and Wayne college campuses, including development of salary fringe benefits, and fixed obligation expenses. The office of resource analysis and budget also develops initial revenue estimates based on a variety of criteria, such as projected credit hours, number of students, consultation with the Ohio board of regents, and approved rates.
 - (3) During the fiscal year, the office of resource analysis and budget monitors and analyzes actual revenues, salaries, and other expenditure components compared to budget; provides support to all units regarding their budgets; researches areas of inquiry and suggests methods for accomplishing objectives; confirms salary

funding availability for each position based on information provided by the initiating unit; and administers deficit account monitoring to ensure compliance with the board of trustees' policy prohibiting departments from operating with deficit balances.

- (4) In addition, the office of resource analysis and budget also distributes monthly computer-generated reports such as budget statements, processes all general fund and auxiliary budget amendments, provides supporting information to campus committees as requested, creates ad hoc reports based on campus-wide and senior management inquiries, projects tuition, fees, and state subsidy revenues utilizing computer models developed by the office, and provides and prepares financial materials for submission by the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer to the board of trustees.
- (5) The director of the office of resource analysis and budget is responsible to associate vice president for treasury and financial planning, who reports directly to the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer. In addition to these duties, this office shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
- (H) Associate vice president for auxiliary enterprises.
 - (1) The associate vice president for auxiliary enterprises shall be appointed by the board upon recommendation of the president, shall hold office at the discretion of the president, and shall be responsible to the president through the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
 - (2) The associate vice president for auxiliary enterprises shall be responsible to the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer for the administration of the functions encompassed by the separate offices of parking services, dining services, retail operations, printing services, materials handling, the Hower house, and telecommunications.
 - (3) The associate vice president for auxiliary enterprises shall be responsible for administration of the services provided by the department of central stores. The disposal of surplus equipment

and supplies is the responsibility of the director of materials handling. The director of materials handling will follow the disposal procedures as outlined in the surplus property recycling handbook.

(4) The associate vice president for auxiliary enterprises shall assist the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer by performing those duties as may be assigned by the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.

(I) Director of student accounts/bursar

- (1) The director of student accounts/bursar shall be appointed by the board upon the recommendation of the president, shall hold office at the discretion of the president, and shall be responsible to the president through the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer.
- (2) The director of student accounts/bursar oversees the update of published tuition and fee schedules and maintenance of system tables necessary to access the accurate student fees each semester.
- (3) The director of student accounts/bursar is responsible for overseeing the process of providing accurate and timely student account information, collecting and processing payments for tuition and fees, and ensuring the timely deposit of university funds.
- (4) The director of student accounts/bursar is responsible for offering payment plan options and the collection of delinquent accounts.
- (5) The director of student accounts/bursar coordinates the distribution of the appropriate tax statement to students annually on tuition charges assessed that may be eligible for a tuition tax credit.
- (6) The director of student accounts/bursar is responsible for the disbursement of financial aid and delivering refunds of excess payments.
- (7) The director of student accounts/bursar shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the vice president for finance and

- (A) The <u>university-internal-auditor</u> chief audit executive ("CAE") shall be appointed by the board upon the joint recommendation of the president and the audit & compliance committee of the board of trustees, and shall hold office at the discretion of the board. The <u>university internal-auditor</u> chief audit executive shall report directly to the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer ("CFO") senior vice president and provost and chief operating officer ("COO") on administrative matters and the board of trustees through the audit & compliance committee of the board on functional matters.
- (B) The university-internal auditor chief audit executive is responsible for conducting financial, operational, compliance and investigative audits. The university internal auditor chief audit executive, with advice and assistance from the vice president for finance and administration and chief financial officer and university administration, including the vice president and general counsel, shall be responsible for developing both short- and long-term internal audit plans, overseeing that audits are properly planned, staffed and completed, and summarizing and communicating results to management the university administration and the audit & compliance committee and the board as appropriate. The university-internal-auditor chief audit executive shall identify where improvements to internal control processes effectiveness and process efficiency should be made to the university's financial, as-well-as and operational, processes.
- (C) The university—internal—auditor chief audit executive shall lead the evaluation and execution of audits associated with the university's compliance requirements, including, for example, compliance with university policies and rules and compliance with laws and applicable state and federal regulatory standards and mandates.
- (D) The university-internal-auditor chief audit executive shall conduct those financial, operational and investigative audits as, from time to time, may be requested by the audit & compliance committee of or the board of trustees, president and university administration, including the vice president and general counsel or vice-president for finance—and administration, and shall perform and be responsible for the following general financial audits and reviews:

- (1) Audit and verify purchase orders and vouchers for bills and salaries; audit receipts of funds, including student tuition and fees, and the deposits thereof in banks and reconciliation of all bank accounts.
- (2) Audit general funds, auxiliary funds, restricted funds, loan funds, endowment funds, plant funds, and agency funds; and, assist the external auditors as appointed by the board and Ohio auditor of state.
- (3) Periodically, and from time to time, inspect securities, inventories, supplies, real property and equipment owned by the university.
- (4) Periodically review and make recommendations for improvements of the system of internal control in effect in-all-subdivisions-and agencies having control of funds and/or property for the entire university.
- (E) The university-internal auditor chief audit executive shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the vice-president-for-finance and administration and chief financial officer ("CFO") or the audit & compliance committee of or the board of trustees and university administration.
- (F) Additional audit personnel. The president may recommend the appointment of additional audit personnel to support the work of the chief audit executive. These additional audit personnel may include a deputy audit executive.

Pertaining to Dr. Luis M. Proenza

WHEREAS, President Luis M. Proenza's leadership has increased The University of Akron's stature and visibility significantly at regional, national and global levels as a result of national and global appointments and activities, with the University now often cited as an exemplar institution for metropolitan community and civic engagement, economic development and innovation; and

WHEREAS, while enhancing the student experience and ensuring the continued quality of academics, Dr. Proenza has overseen enrollment growth in both student credit-hour production and student headcount for six consecutive years, bringing overall enrollment to 29,251 in fall 2010 while also reflecting a higher average ACT score for incoming freshmen; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Proenza has enabled the extension of the University's aggressive \$500-million goal of its comprehensive fund-raising campaign to \$1 billion, with more than \$700 million received or pledged by the end of 2010, and with 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 being the third-best and most successful fundraising years in the University's history with gifts totaling approximately \$41 million and \$47 million, respectively, now exceeding the five-year moving average by 27 percent; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Proenza provided leadership to the Ohio Board of Regents, Inter-University Council and other state university presidents to maintain State Issue 1, which authorized the state of Ohio to issue up to \$700 million in bonds to renew and continue the highly successful Ohio Third Frontier Initiative; and

WHEREAS, during Dr. Proenza's tenure and with his guidance, the University and its Research Foundation have teamed with business and industry partners on more than 115 active research projects, helped to launch or attract more than 40 companies, generated more than \$40 million per year in federal and private research funding, and helped to attract more than \$50 million in private funding for regional technology-based enterprises; and

WHEREAS, with Dr. Proenza's direction and through partnerships between the University, the University of Akron Research Foundation and Austen BioInnovation Institute in Akron, national acclaim and millions of dollars in funding were garnered, including the BioInnovation Institute and Research Foundation winning the Chicago Region i6 Challenge, a new \$12-million innovation competition led by the U.S. Department of Commerce's Economic Development Administration in partnership with the National Institutes of Health and the National Science Foundation; and

WHEREAS, the University Park Alliance has successfully been transformed into its next iteration through its merger with the University Park Development Corporation to enhance efforts to transform the University Park neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Proenza has overseen the continuing success of the New Landscape for Learning initiative, as five new facilities worth a total of \$72.7 million were inaugurated during 2010 and 2011 to date; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Proenza led 18 months of planning, involving nearly 2,000 campus and community participants, that culminated in the strategic plan-Vision 2020: The New Gold Standard, which sets forth a new vision, mission and goals; and

WHEREAS, the University simultaneously took significant measures to enhance safeguards for fiscal sustainability and to improve the efficiencies of its internal processes, and some of this work has been recognized with national awards in Human Resources and national recognition of safety management; and

WHEREAS, successful searches were completed for key positions during the past 18 months, including those for Senior Vice President, Provost and Chief Operating Officer; Dean of the Buchtel College of Arts and Sciences; Dean of the College of Business Administration; and Vice President for Finance and Administration and Chief Financial Officer; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Proenza's 2009-2011 three-year goals were advanced by—building partnerships and facilitating collaboration with varied constituencies to position the University as one offering great value and being very responsive to the University System of Ohio Strategic Plan; providing the leadership and framework for significant alignment with state and federal higher education priorities through Vision 2020; and participating in many local, regional, national and international organizations, thus enhancing recognition of the University; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of The University of Akron increases Dr. Proenza's annual base salary to \$405,000, effective January 1, 2011; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board establishes the Luis and Theresa Proenza Endowed Scholarship Fund with initial funding of \$100,000 to reflect the Proenzas' contributions and ongoing commitment to student success at The University of Akron.
